Wildlife policy

- List legislation relating to wildlife
 - Law on Forest Protection and Development (2004) and the Forest law (2017): to protect wildlife in the forest
 - Law on Biodiversity (2008): to preserve natural species and genes of wildlife
 - Criminal Code (2015 & the modification in 2019): to penalize violations for wildlife
 - Veterinary law (2015): disease control for wildlife



Wildlife policy

- Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources is responsible for
 - Overall plan for biodiversity at national level
 - List of endangered, precious and rare species
 - Prevention of exotic species invasion
- Ministry of Agriculture and Rural development is responsible for
 - Specifying the protection of wild species banned from exploitation
 - Assisting the Government in performing the state management of forestry including wildlife
 - Disease control in wild animals



Activities relating to wildlife

- Briefly outline activities performed by Veterinary Services relating to wildlife
 - Rescuing wildlife from trafficking
 - Wildlife import export management
 - Disease surveillance: Avian influenza in wild birds
 - Disease management in wildlife captive farms
- Briefly outline other activities performed in the country relating to wildlife health
 - Support WCS in surveillance in wild animals (pangolins, bats, rats, etc.)



Disease reporting

- Summary of key diseases reported in wildlife in the past year
 - H5N1 virus was detected in one Asian openbill in Tram Chim national park in April 2021
 - African swine fever virus in four fecal samples of wild boars in Dong Nai province
 - Coronavirus in one pangolin (Betacoronavirus- Pangolin strain)
 - Coronavirus in three bats (Alphacoronavirus Bat coronavirus)



One Health

- Outline how wildlife are included in One Health activities
 - Wildlife is a key component in One Health Partnership (OPH) strategic plan in Viet Nam during 2021 to 2025
 - A wildlife network has been established between DAH and CITES, FAO, WCS



Future activities

- List 3 priority activities relating to wildlife health in your country over 2021-2022.
 - Establishment of wildlife technical working group under OHP
 - Development of SOP for disease surveillance in wildlife (led by DAH with technical support of WCS for natural wildlife, and of FAO for captive wildlife)
 - Disease surveillance
