
Wildlife policy

- WILD ANIMAL CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION ACT, B.E. 2562 (2019)
- Highlight Ministerial responsibilities
 - Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment
 - Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation (DNP)



Activities relating to wildlife

- Activities performed by Veterinary Services relating to wildlife
 - Clinical care of wildlife : illegal wildlife trade, injured wildlife : Inside and outside protected areas
 - Disease surveillance in wildlife: Avian influenza (Birds), Nipah virus (Bat), Corona virus (Bat and others)
 - Necropsy wildlife carcasses: National Park, Sanctuary
 - Disease control: Coordinate with other organizations













Disease reporting

- Summary of key diseases reported in wildlife in the past year
 - 2020-2021
 - Al surveillance
 - Residence and Migratory birds 1,300 samples (cloacal swab)
 - Negative
 - 2020
 - ASF surveillance: FAO, DLD, DNP and ZPOT
 - Captive wild boar, 66 samples of each (Whole blood, Sera, Nasal swab and Rectal swab)
 - Negative
