Up date of Accreditation of Veterinary Education Programs of Veterinary Schools belongs to SEAVSA





Almost of Veterinary Schools in South-East Asia have Evaluation and Accreditation of Veterinary Education Programs by different ways.



Indonesia case

(Source : *Prof. Yonni Ashihadi*, Borgo University, Indonesia)

- From 2007 until 2019 all high education establishments should have accreditation from a National Higher Education Accreditation Body (called BAN-PT).
- Since 2019, veterinary schools and all study programs in medicine have to be accredited **by an independent accreditation body-specific in medicine**, called **LAMPT Kes** (The Indonesian Accreditation Agency for Higher Education in Health (IAAHEH)).

Indonesia case

- **This accreditation body** provides a specific instrument for the accreditation of veterinary schools (modification from international accreditation standards such as AVBC, EAEVE, etc).
- **The accreditation is valid for 7 years** and should be renewed. If we do not have accreditation status, it is illegal to conduct the teaching in our law and can not produce graduates. **This LAMPT Kes** is recognized by WFME (World Federation of Medical Education).

Thailand case

(Source : From Prof. Khongsak Thiangtum, Kasetsart University)

- 1. Generally, all VEEs in Thailand are regulated by the Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research and Innovation.**
- 2. Veterinary profession in Thailand be regulated by Veterinary Council of Thailand (VCT).**
- 3. By law, VCT has no authority to involve in teaching management of VEEs but practically, all VEEs still follow standard accreditation by VCT.**
- 4. VCT will endorse VEEs which meet standard issued by VCT.**
- 5. Re-endorsement will take place in every 5 years.**

Thailand Case

- 6. Two VEEs in Thailand are under process for international standard accreditation which are Chulalongkorn University for EAEVE and Kasetsart University for AVBC.**
- 7. Results from OIE VSB Twinning program suggest new 11 standards for VEEs accreditation which has been reported to VCT.**
- 8. Thailand VEEs dean consortium with the chairman (Dean Khongsak) is going to process for study and research in Veterinary Education in Thailand. Data will be used for development of veterinary education in the country and international collaboration.**

Vietnam Case

- Almost of Veterinary Schools and other universities in Vietnam is regulated by Ministry of Education and Training (MOET).
- Evaluation and Accreditation Body for Higher Education Program in Vietnam that are Department of Quality Control, Ministry of Education and Training.
- MOET requirement all universities had to Evaluation and Accreditation of Education Programs.
- The accreditation is valid for 5 years and should be renewed.
- *All Veterinary Schools in Vietnam are Implementing the Evaluation and Accreditation of the Education Programs under Department of Quality Control , MOET.*

Vietnam Case

- Evaluation and Accreditation of the Veterinary Education Programs in Universities base on.
 - Accreditation domestic standard :
Vietnamese Standard by Department of Quality Control, Ministry of Education and Training.
 - Accreditation International Standard :
AUN (Asian University Network) standard

Vietnam Case

Up to now : In Vietnam have two Veterinary Schools got Accreditation certificates from AUN

- **Nong Lam University (2020)**
- **Tra Vinh University (2020)**
- Other Veterinary Schools under process with Evaluation and Accreditation for Education programs base on AUN standard. (Expected in 2022 there are 4 Veterinary Schools can get Accreditation Certificate from AUN)
