Technical Advisory 31 August 2018

The Philippine swine industry is one of the biggest contributors to the country's agricultural growth, posting over 16% increase in gross earnings, owing to the increasing demand for pork and production expansion. The country's total swine inventory is estimated at 12.78 million as of 1 July 2018. The Philippines ranks eighth (8°) in the world in terms of pork volume production and number of breeding sows. Historically, the country is free from African Swine Fever (ASF). Thus, incursion of the disease in the Philippines will result to great economic loss due to direct and indirect damages to the industry.

In relation to the current outbreak of ASF in South Africa, Europe, Russia and now in China, and to protect the local swine industry, the Department of Agriculture (DA) has issued the foll Memoranda as part of precautionary measures to prevent the entry of the disease into the quantity of the disease into the quantity.

- DA Memorandum Order No. 22 Series of 2018 "Prohibition on the Use of Food Wastes/Left-overs from International and Domestic Airports and Sea Swine Swill Feed Throughout the Country"
- DA Memorandum Order No. 23 Series of 2018 "Temporary Ban on the Imp of Domestic and Wild Pigs and their Products Including Pork Meat and Originating from Latvia, Poland, Romania, Russia, Ukraine and China"


All veterinary quarantine personnel in our international airports and seaports have been al prevent the entry of the disease.

African Swine Fever (ASF) is a highly contagious hemorrhagic disease of domestic a pigs of all ages. The disease is characterized by high fever, loss of appetite, hemorrhages in and internal organs, and death which follows between 2-10 days on the average. Mortality c high as 100%. The disease is listed as notifiable disease in the World Organization for Anima (OIE) Terrestrial Animal Health Code and must be reported to the OIE World Animal Information System (WAHIS) once detected.

Although not considered a zoonotic disease, swine raisers are encouraged to strengt strictly implement farm biosecurity measures. The public is enjoined to support the gover efforts by reporting to veterinary authorities any unusual pig mortalities, pork smuggling a or meat items handcarried by travellers coming from affected countries.

As stated above, China is currently experiencing outbreaks of ASF in four (4) provine the first case having been reported last 3 August 2018 in Lianning province. The Chinese gow has taken necessary control measures which include the following: stamping out; destruanimal products and disposal of carcasses, by-products and waste; movement control in country; surveillance outside containment and/or protection zone; screening; quarant disinfection; control of wildlife reservoirs; and zoning. Despite the control measures implement the disease has spread to three (3) other provinces which occurred in less than a month after the initial outbreak.

Chinese authorities are still investigating the source and still determining how it entered the country. However, the genetic analysis of the virus is completely similar to the Russian ASF 2017 strain.


