Impact of AHS outbreaks on OIE official status and on international movement of competition horses



Impacts

Until restored AHS-free status:

- Thailand will have to rely on horses stationed in AHS-free countries for participation in international events
- No international championships, games, qualifiers or finals will be allocated to Thailand
- Impact on AHS-status of neighbouring countries? Long term effects on development of the horse sports in the region
- Impact on horse export from South Africa??



Recommendations – outbreak preparedness and management

- Ensure traceability of ALL equidae
 - ID (microchip + diagram)
 - Establishments / holdings
 - Movements of epidemiological importance

Registered in a database

- List of regional laboratories with accredited method for AHS analysis
- Organise national/regional rapid response teams for sampling etc.
- Prepare communication plan to ensure fast, correct communication and reports in relevant languages to stakeholders within the country, to NVAs in the neighbouring countries, OIE etc.



Recommendations – outbreak preparedness and management

- Develop a structured Horse Industry Outbreak Management Support team (HIOMS)
- OIE to continue inviting the regional Horse Industry to OIEs educational workshops on AHS and extend scenario exercises to include HIOMS
- Horse Industry organised workshops for national and regional private stakeholders (in cooperation with NVAs)



Recommendations – minimizing risks

- Ideally a global stop for trade with wild animals from infected areas
- Import and export of animals, regardless of wild or domesticated, should strictly be administrated by ONE national authority, ie. the National Veterinary Authority that is member of the OIE
- Vaccine banks established and maintained (inactivated DIVA vaccine when available)



Recommendations – AHS status

- Handbook/manual to guide the application for AHS-free status
- Transparency share information > Opportunity to improve protocols, legislation etc.
