





Special Meeting of the SEACFMD National Coordinators focused on FMD Preparedness and Response (12 June 2022)

Number of recommendations to enhance FMD preparedness and Response

- FMD preparedness Review Legislative framework, Contingency Plan, Surveillance System, HR Capacity, Laboratory diagnostic capacity, Financing etc.
- Enhance early warning risk assessment, targeted surveillance, epidemiological intelligence etc.
- Rapid detection refresher course for animal health staff, awareness to animal owners, surveillance, develop laboratory diagnostic capacity.
- Enhance Rapid response review and test contingency plan, improve Incident Command System, develop emergency vaccination plan.
 - > WOAH SRRSEA shared relevant resources to the Indonesia and other MCs at the risk of FMD incursion.
