IHR - PVS NBW

- A Tripartite (FAO, WHO, WOAH) Programme focusing on NBWs and their follow-up in countries.
- A three-day workshop
- Participants: 60-90 national stakeholders from animal health and human health services at national, regional and local levels, as well as representatives of other relevant sectors (environment, wildlife, media, police, etc.)
- Bridging of WHO IHR (International Health Regulations) and WOAH PVS (Performance of Veterinary Services) Pathway



NBW: Specific Objectives

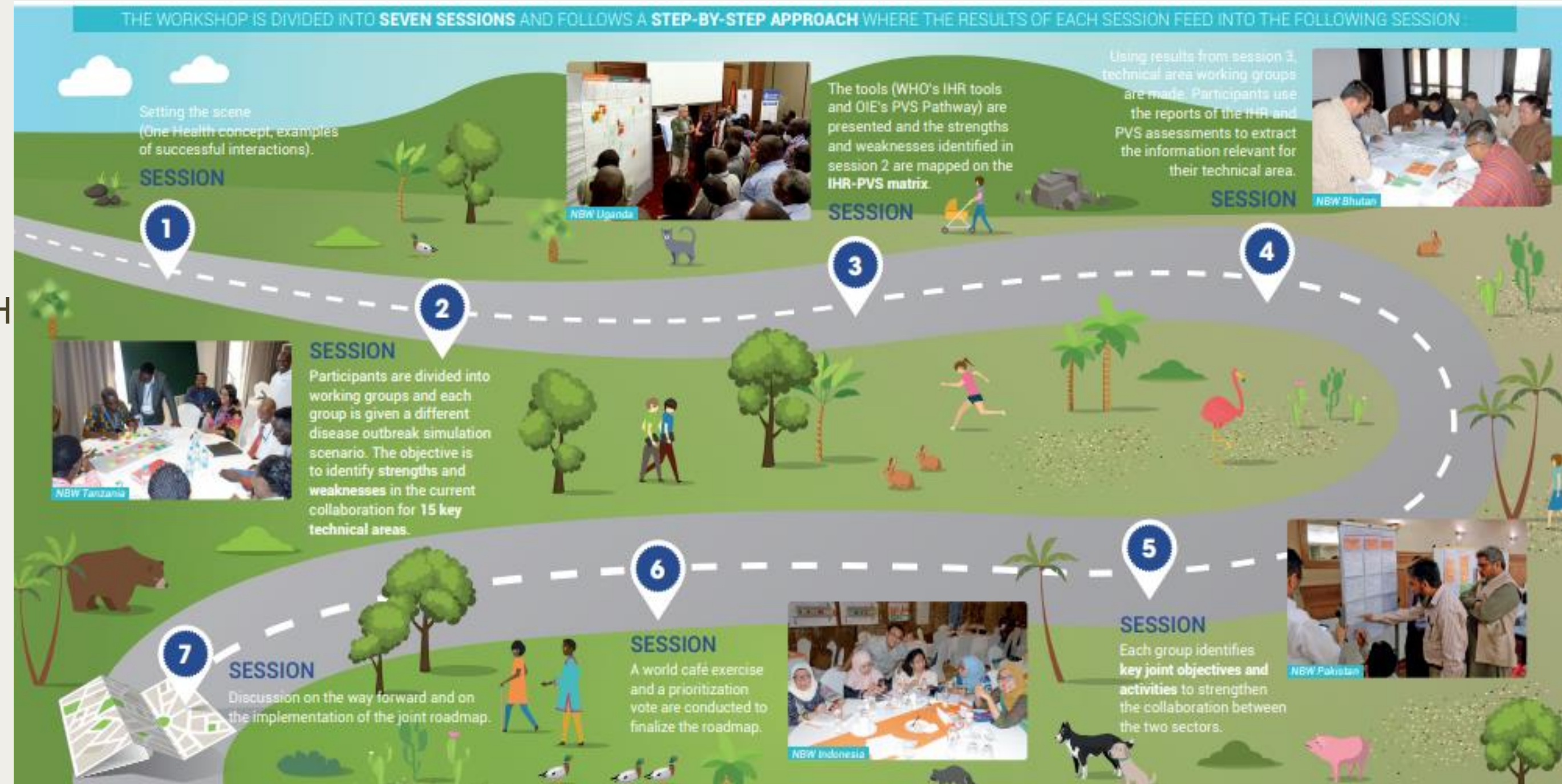
- **Brainstorming:** Discuss the outcomes of IHR and PVS Pathway country assessments and identify ways to use the outputs
- **Advancing One Health (OH):** Improve dialogue, coordination and collaboration between animal and human health sectors to strategically plan areas for joint action and synergistic approach
- **Building Sustainable Networks:** Contribute to strengthening inter-sectoral collaboration through improved understanding of respective roles and mandates
- **Strategic planning:** Inform planning and investments based on a structured and agreed identification of needs and options for improvement



NBW: Programme

NBW: Key Outputs



A diagnosis of current **strengths and weaknesses in the coordination** between animal and human health services for 15 technical areas that are key for the prevention, detection and response to health events at the human-animal interface.



NBW Roadmap: a harmonized, actionable and realistic **joint roadmap of activities** that the country develops and will implement to improve the multisectoral collaboration.

NBW: Follow-up Phase

THE FOLLOW-UP PHASE IS BASED ON FOUR KEY PILLARS TO SUPPORT COUNTRIES IN THE CONCRETE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NBW ROADMAP



NBW CATALYST:

A One Health expert recruited at the national level to provide technical support, suggest operational tools and organize events for the follow-up and the implementation of the NBW Roadmap.



POST-NBW MEETINGS:

Every 1-2 years, to evaluate the implementation of the NBW Roadmap activities, identify bottlenecks and needed support, and update the roadmap, using specific follow-up material and tools.



TRIPARTITE SUPPORT:

Technical (and when possible, financial) support from the Tripartite organizations for the implementation of NBW Roadmap activities, including through guidelines and operational tools to address specific needs.



NBW COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE:

A community of practice with national NBW Catalysts from around the world and NBW regional coordinators, to share experiences, good practices and challenges through an online forum and regular reunions.

- **Indonesia:** NBW catalyst, NBW-Rabies (Apr 2023)
- **Philippines:** Workshop on Planning and Review of the Philippines National Strategic Plan on Zoonoses (Apr 2023)
- **Thailand:** High-level Workshop on National One Health Coordination, Conference on Harmonizing Emerging and Re-emerging Zoonotic Disease Management in Thailand (May 2023)
