1A. To ensure **adequate, appropriately allocated and competent** veterinarians and veterinary paraprofessionals including delegation of specific official tasks to private veterinarians



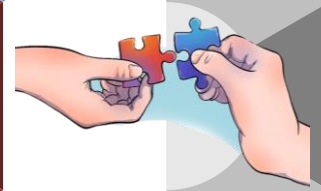
1B. To strengthen and adapt the **organisational structure** in order to provide an effective and efficient veterinary service delivery system

2A. To perform **Risk Analysis** on animal diseases (zoonotic and economic impact) of national importance

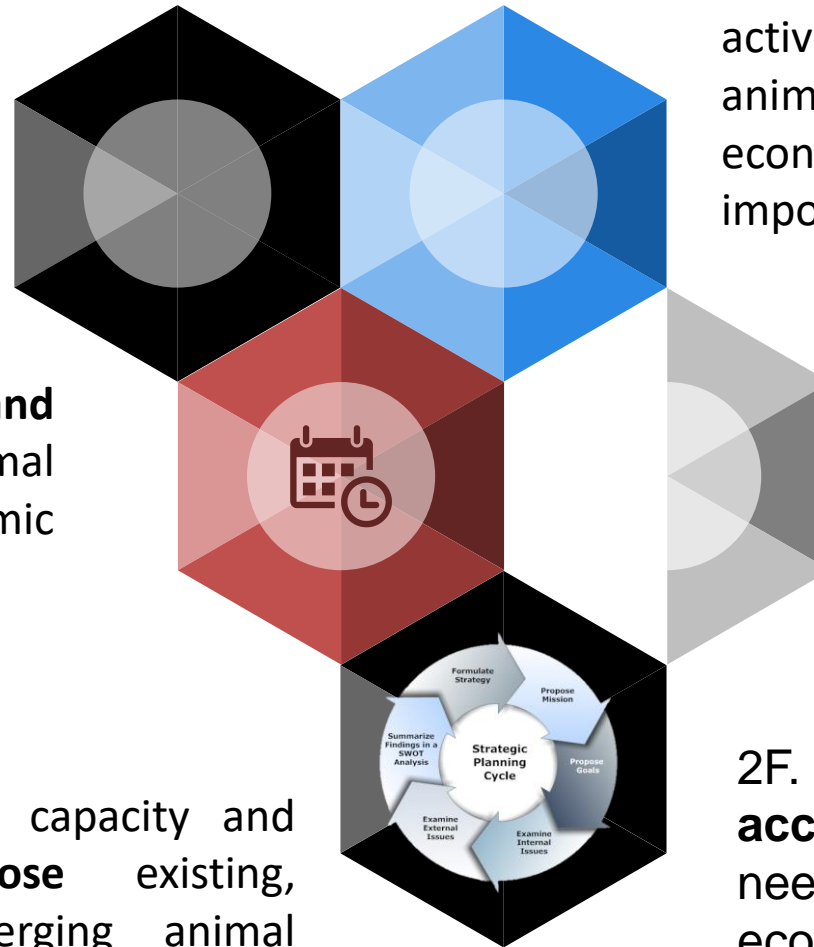
2B. To strengthen the passive and active **surveillance programme** on animal diseases (zoonotic and economic impact) of national importance

2E. To strengthen the capacity and capability to **diagnose** existing, emerging and re-emerging animal diseases

2F. To maintain and extend the scope of **accreditation to all diagnostic tests** needed on animal diseases (zoonotic and economic impact) of national importance



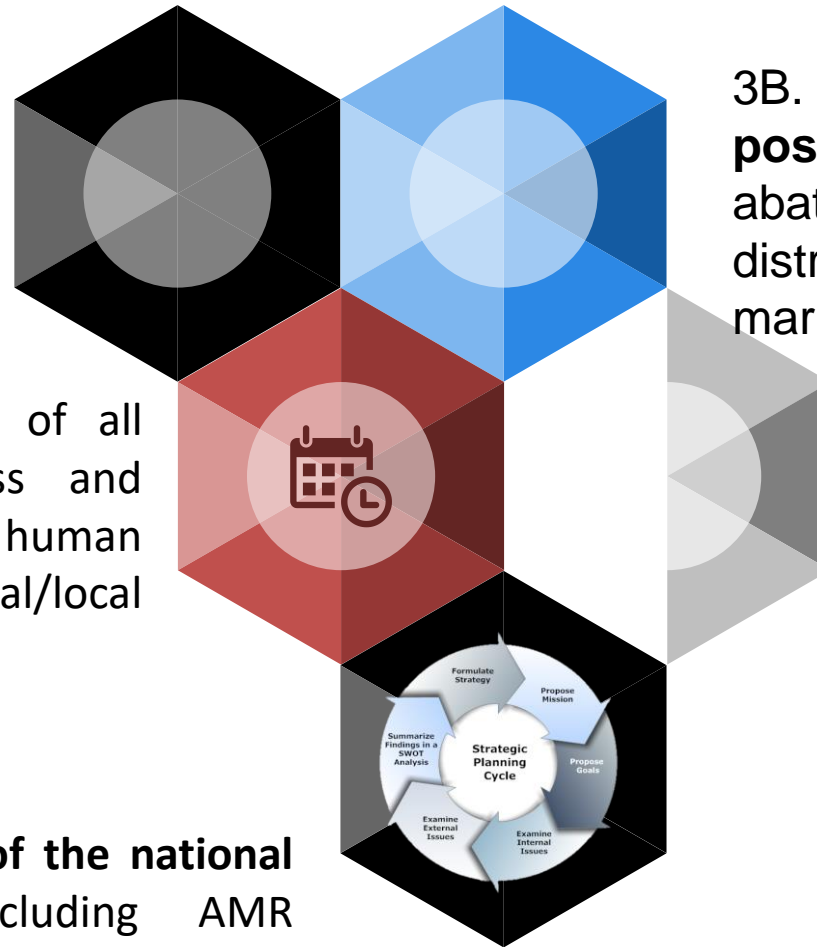
# 3. VETERINARY PUBLIC HEALTH (VPH)

## 5 Priority Objectives

3A. To Develop a specific overarching **policy** to strengthen monitoring and control of foodborne disease and contamination in food of animal origin

3C. To ensure similar **sanitary level** of all establishment that produce, process and distribute product of animal origin for human consumption that supply the national/local market.

3E. To ensure **implementation of the national action plan for AMR**, including AMR surveillance and responsible and prudent use of antimicrobials in animal health and animal feed



3B. To ensure adequate **ante and post mortem inspection** for all abattoirs producing meat for distribution in the national and local market.

3D. To enhance **regulation and control** of the distribution and use of veterinary drugs and biologicals, including antimicrobials

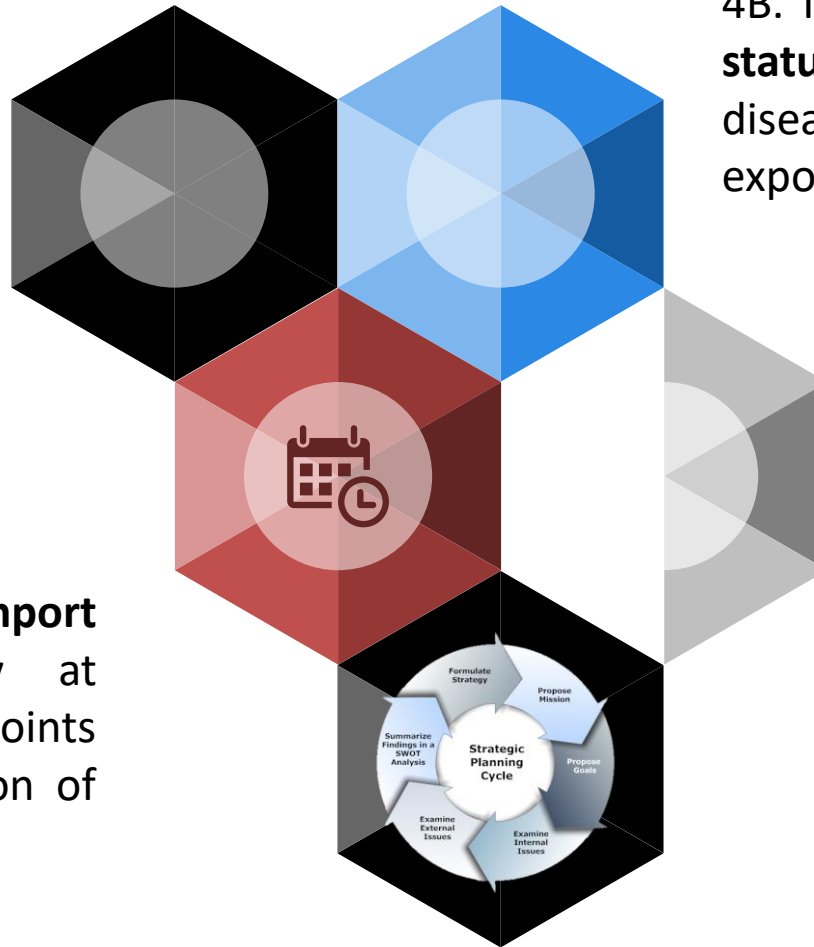


# 4. TRADE

## 4 Priority Objectives

4A. To strengthen and broaden the implementation of **identification and traceability systems** for animals, animal products animal feed and other veterinary products

4C. To strengthen **risk based import protocols and border security** at gazetted and non-gazetted entry points in order to prevent the introduction of diseases into the country



4B. To maintain existing specific **disease free status** and explore the establishment of **disease free zones and compartments** for export certification and trade purposes

4D. To promote and facilitate trade through **sanitary agreements, equivalence** for trade purposes
