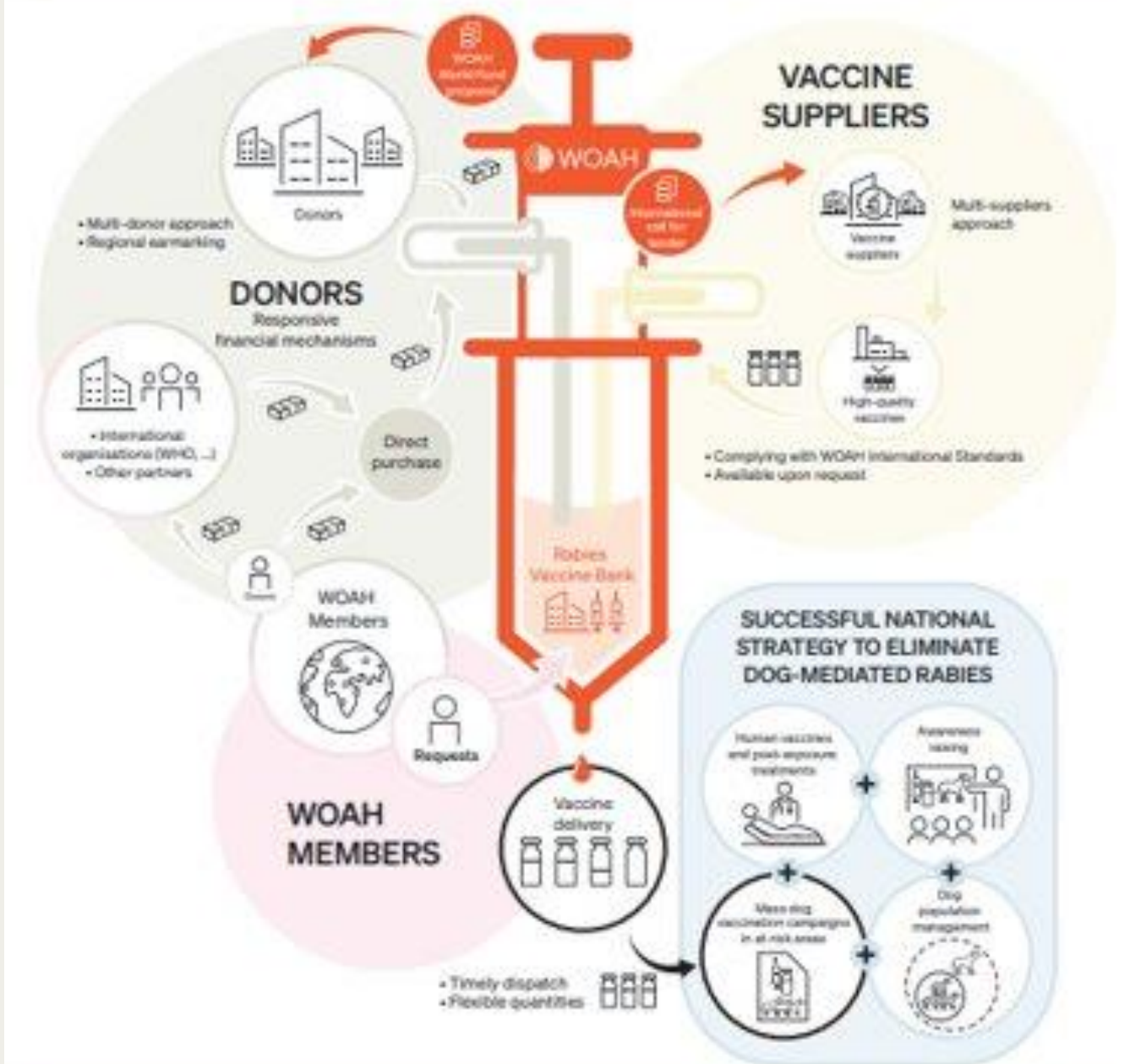
The approach

- Tool available to support WOAHA Members strategy against rabies.
- 10 years operation. First established in 2012
- 2 suppliers selected through international calls for tender (3 call for tenders executed since the beginning)
- Virtual Vaccine Bank (no storage) > supply agreement upon request
- WOAHA does not take any fee out of the service
- Voluntary mechanism!

CANINE RABIES VACCINES TO SAVE HUMAN LIVES

RABIES kills nearly **59,000 PERSONS PER YEAR** with more than **99%** of cases originating from infected **DOG BITES**.

By providing high-quality dog vaccines, our vaccine bank helps countries implement vaccination campaigns and eliminate dog-mediated human rabies.



Added value of the WOAAH Vaccine Bank

High quality vaccines

Rapid delivery

Limited red tape

Different funding sources possible (WOAH, country, partners)



Negotiated prices

How to access the Vaccine Bank?

- Liaise with the corresponding WOAAH Regional office to express your interest
- Identify funding for the vaccines before sending the official request to WOAAH
- Define the main characteristics of your request (quantity, vials, delivery date...)
- Complete the Justification Form presenting the situation and the need for rabies vaccines
- Submit an official letter from WOAAH Delegate to the WOAAH Director General only after exchanges with WOAAH Regional office
- After implementation of the vaccination campaign, provide a final report to WOAAH

Official request should come from WOAAH Delegate or the Minister

- South-East Asia by far the first region using and beneficiary of the mechanism since 2012
- Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Vietnam used the mechanism
- Current discussion with Brunei and Cambodia for new deliveries
- Diversity of funding options used

Conclusion

- WOAHA Rabies Vaccine Bank is a voluntary basis mechanism at the disposal of WOAHA Members which would like to use this service
- South-East Asia have shown good use of the mechanism in the past 10 years
- WOAHA Rabies Vaccine Bank is a proven tool for catalysing country engagement
- Allocate funding to fight rabies remain key and vaccines are just one portion of the cost
- Political will to eliminate rabies remain the pillar of any results toward the elimination of rabies by 2030.
