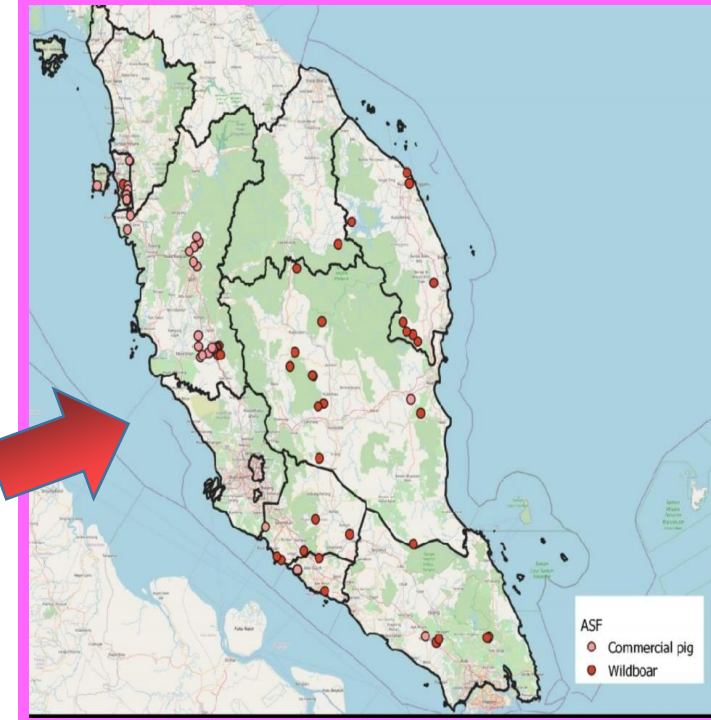

## Timeline of ASF Outbreak Cases in Malaysia



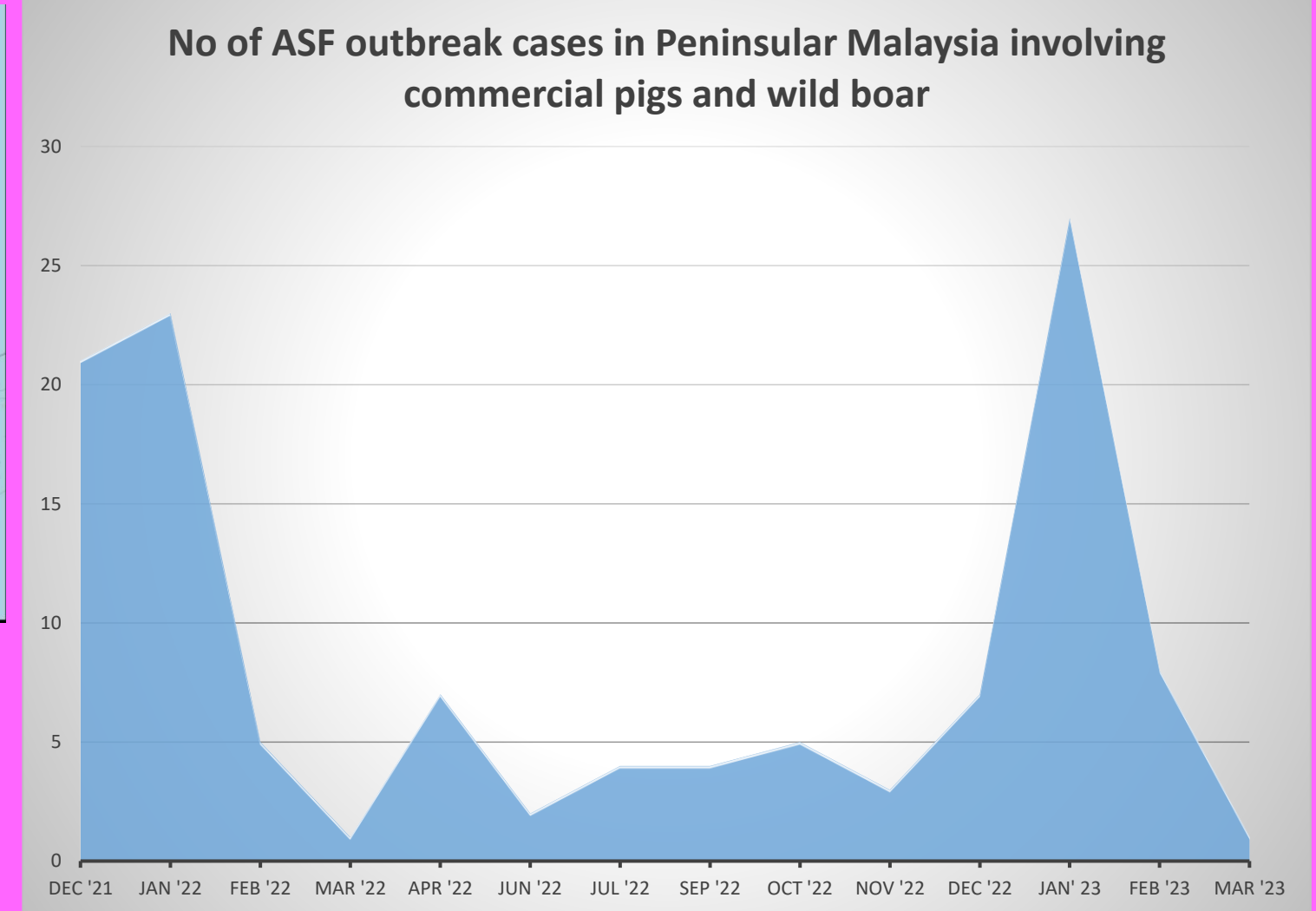
Timeline of the occurrence of ASF Outbreak Cases in each states in Malaysia



Distribution of ASF Cases in Peninsular

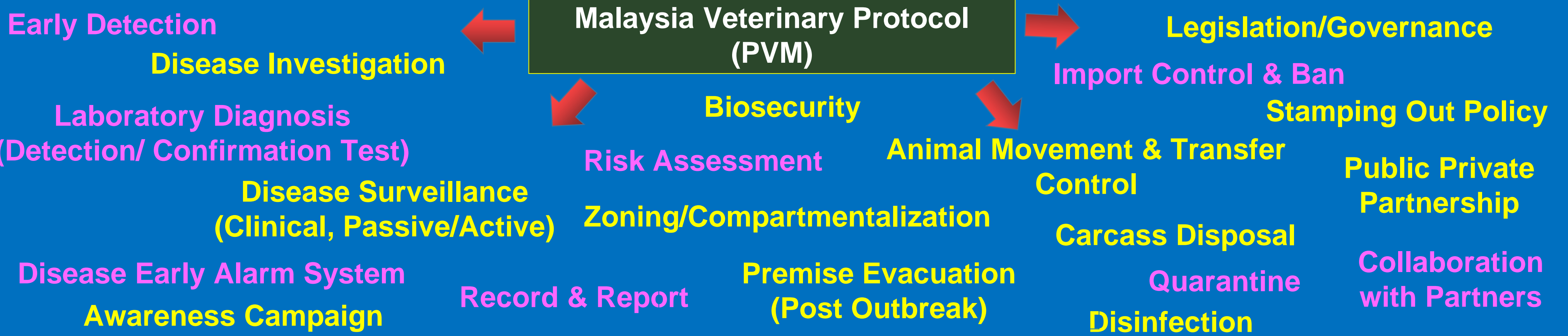

MAIN CHALLENGES

### Main challenges experienced by Malaysia involving:-

- 1) Sustainable funding - with increase of other emerging and re-emerging diseases + higher cost of lab testing requirements >> Malaysia requires financial aids to support the ASF control activities.
- 2) Safer Trade - enhancing the risk assessment and import protocols >> Malaysia requires collaborative and cooperative commitments from many Inter-agencies/Public Private Partnerships.
- 3) Technical issues - impromptu access to certain facilities or equipments (i.e. roro/special transport).
- 4) Politics - i.e. land issues (for disposal of carcasses).
- 5) Lack of awareness VS Attitudes (farmers, public, tourist) >> Malaysia has strengthening the awareness campaign.

### Way forward to strengthen and improve capacities and capabilities through/in:

- 1) Governance & Legislation - policy, guideline protocols, etc.
- 2) Funding towards preparedness & control/prevention activities - more sustain
- 3) Early Detection/Early Warning Alarm System
- 4) Enhance knowledge and skills (training, sharing) - epidemiology, laboratory
- 5) Safer trades -- Food Security
- 6) More collaborations & Public Private Partnerships, continuous communication & Awareness Campaign
