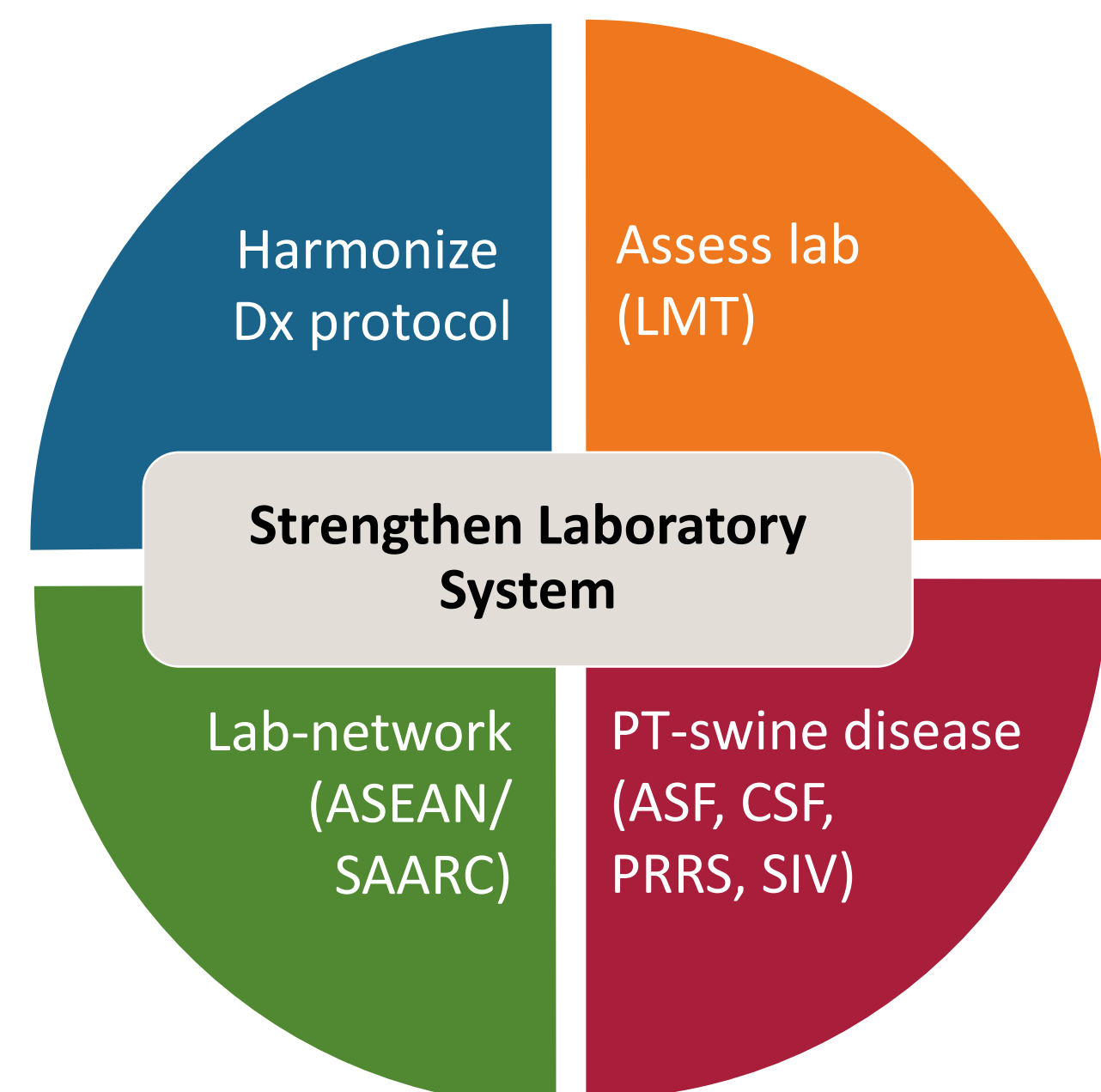

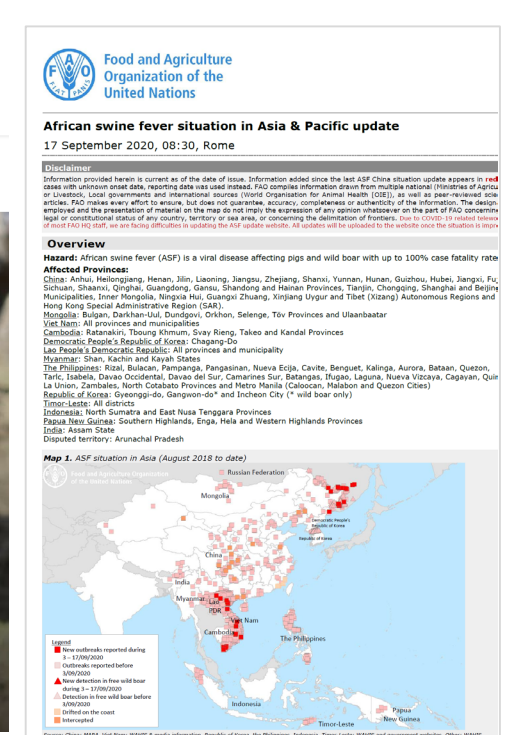
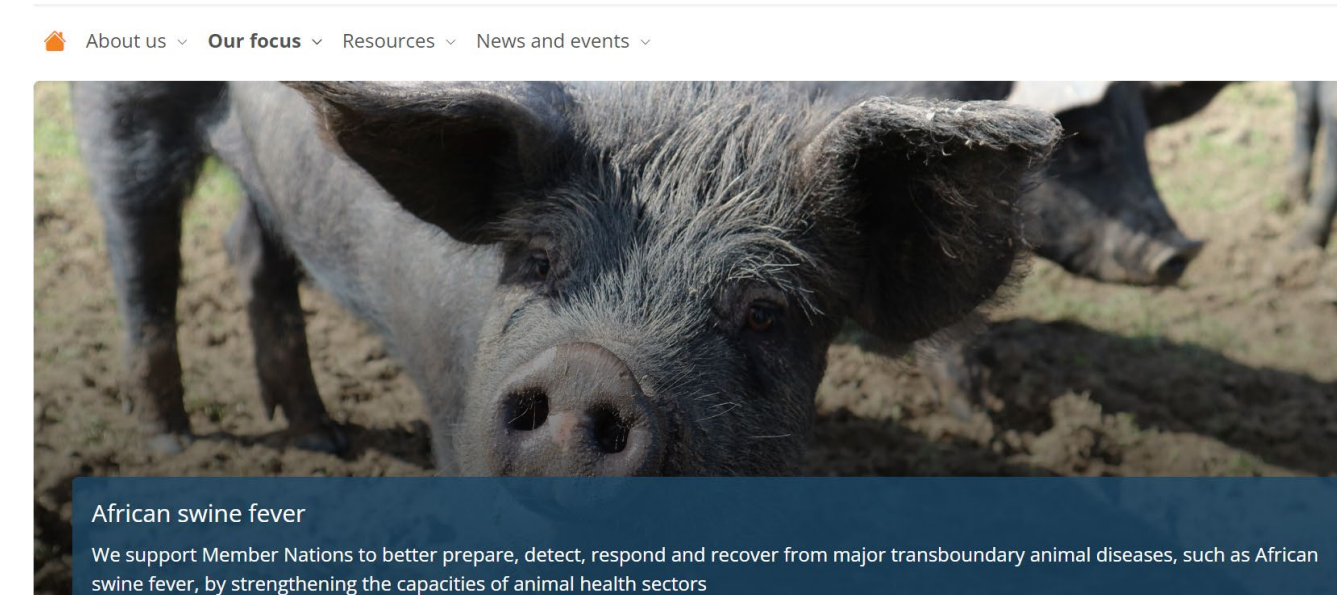

- One regional online course on value chain analysis for animal disease risk management

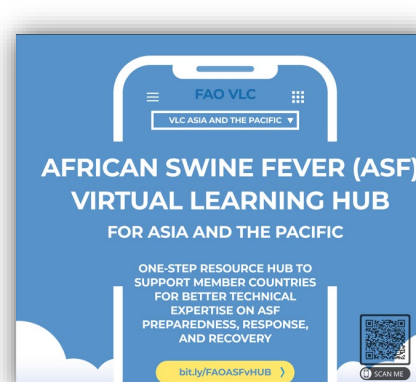
