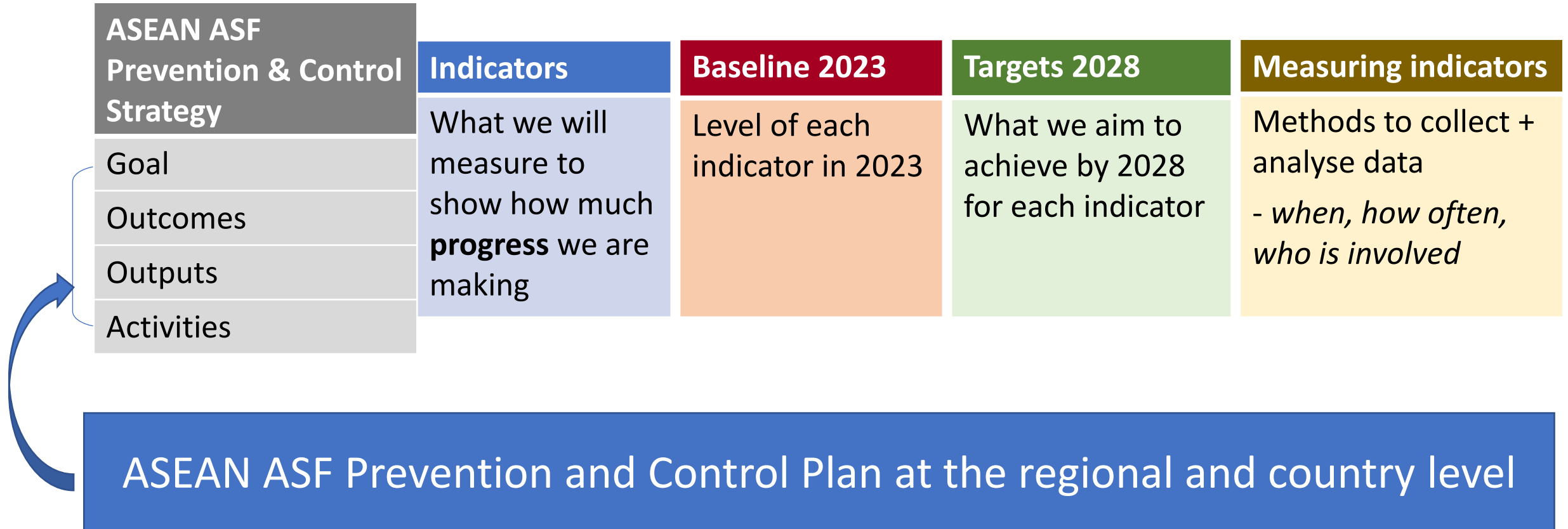

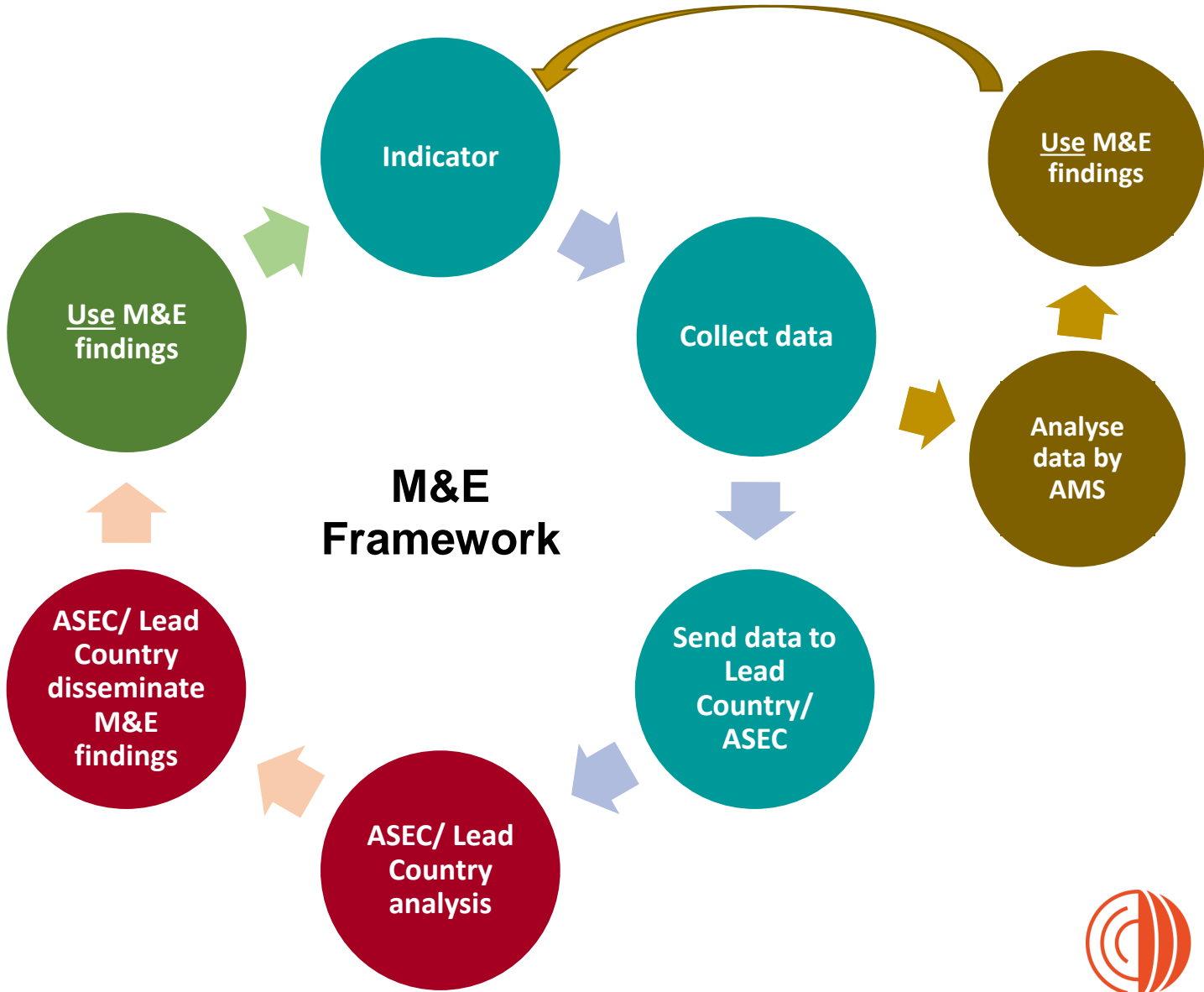
Why do we need M&E framework?

Evidence – reliable robust information!

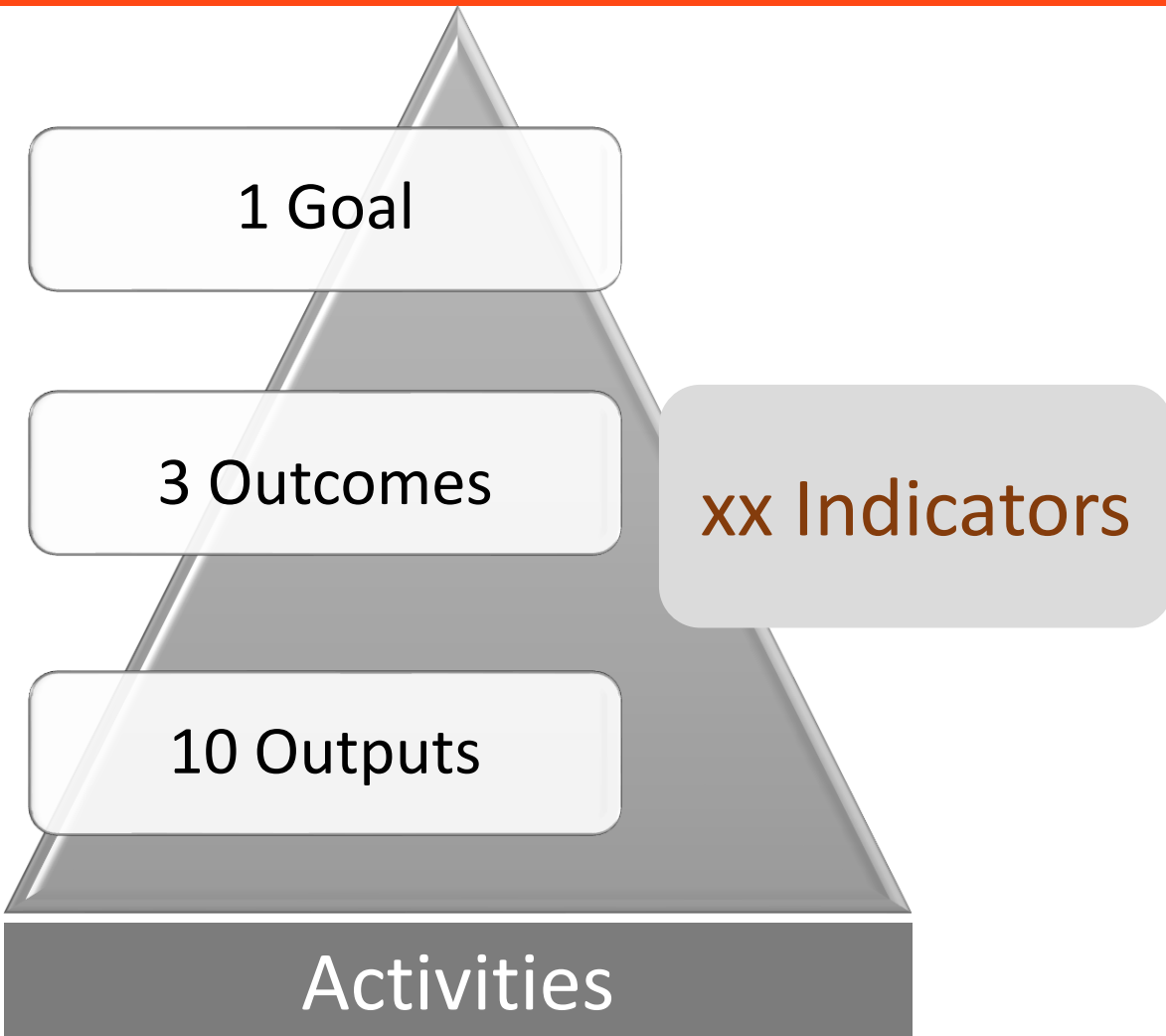
- ✓ Progress

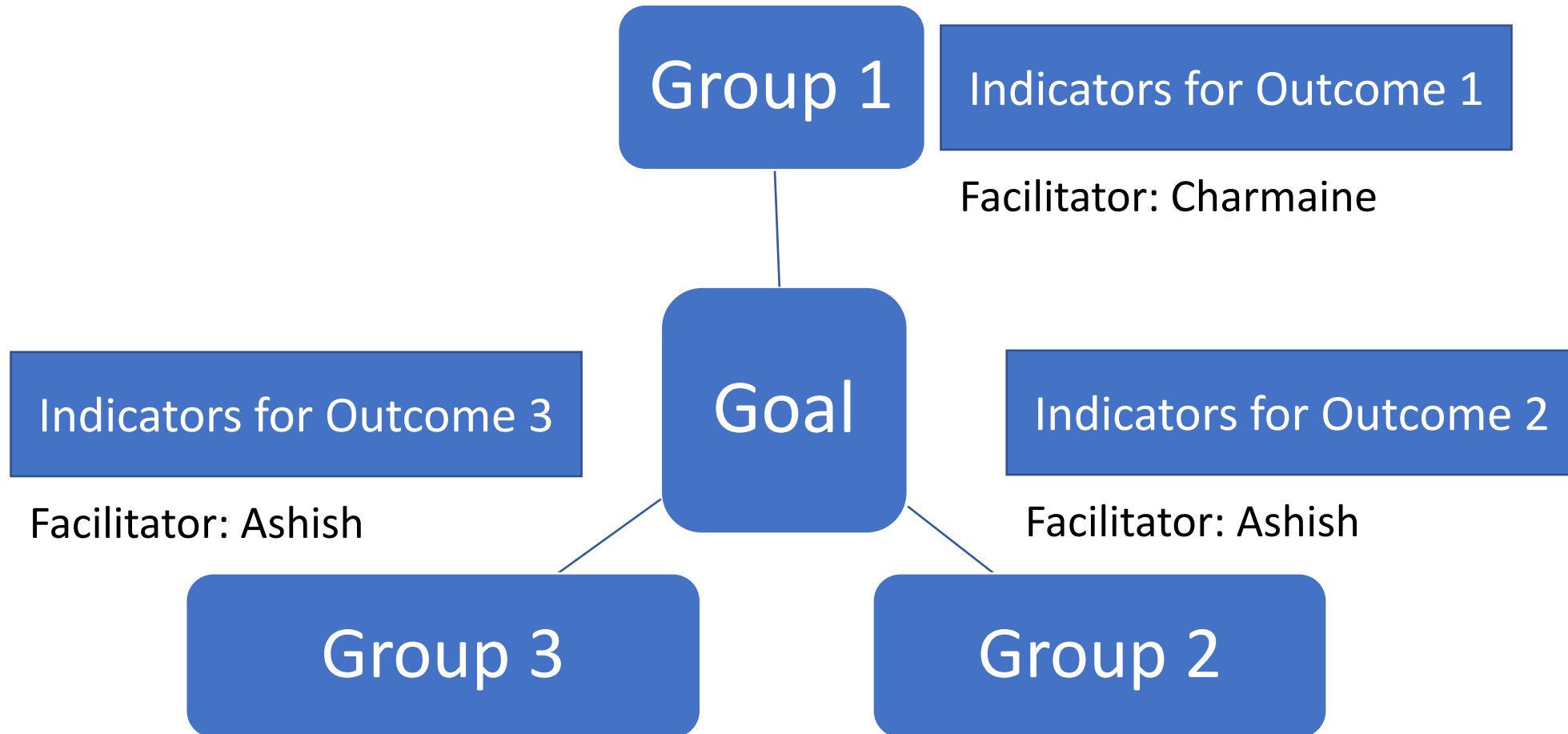

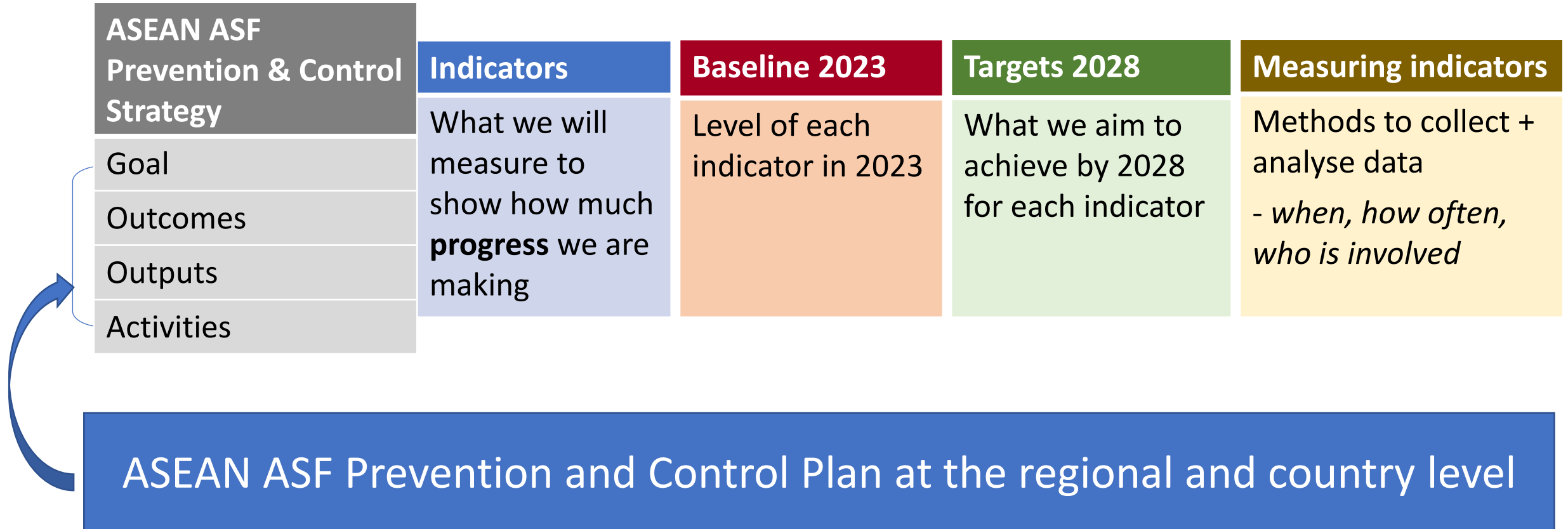
