What is the GF-TADs ?

- **The Global Framework for the progressive control of Transboundary Animal Diseases (GF-TADs) is a joint FAO/OIE initiative, launched in 2004.**
- **At the regional level in Asia and the Pacific, the aim has been to enhance the prevention, detection and control of transboundary animal diseases (TADs) by providing a platform with the combined strengths of both international organizations working with their members (and partners?) to achieve agreed common objectives.**



What is unique about Asia and the Pacific ?

- **Very large and diverse with quite complex cross border value chains.**
- **We have divided into 4 subregions, but in reality, there is no clear-cut delineation.**
- **There are many different organisations from all over the world working in the region on TADs and other animal health related topics.**

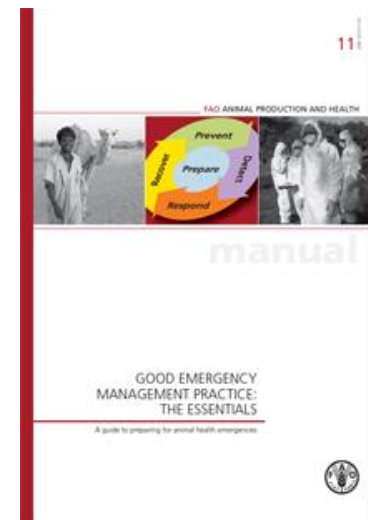
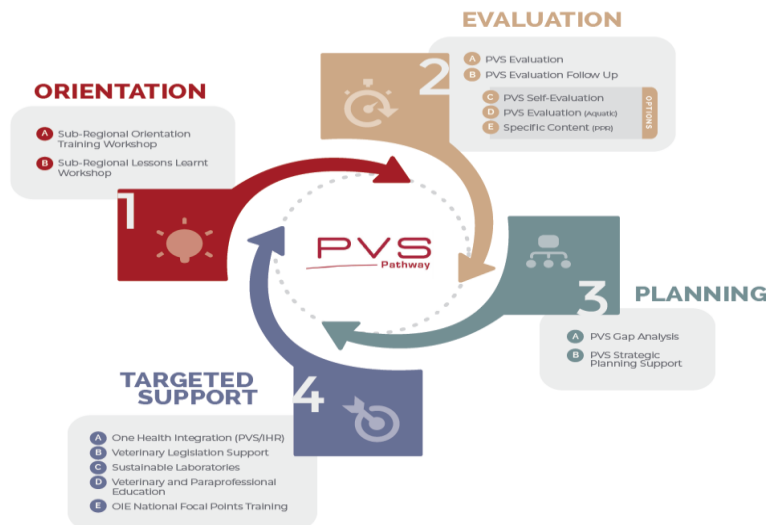




Cross-cutting Topics

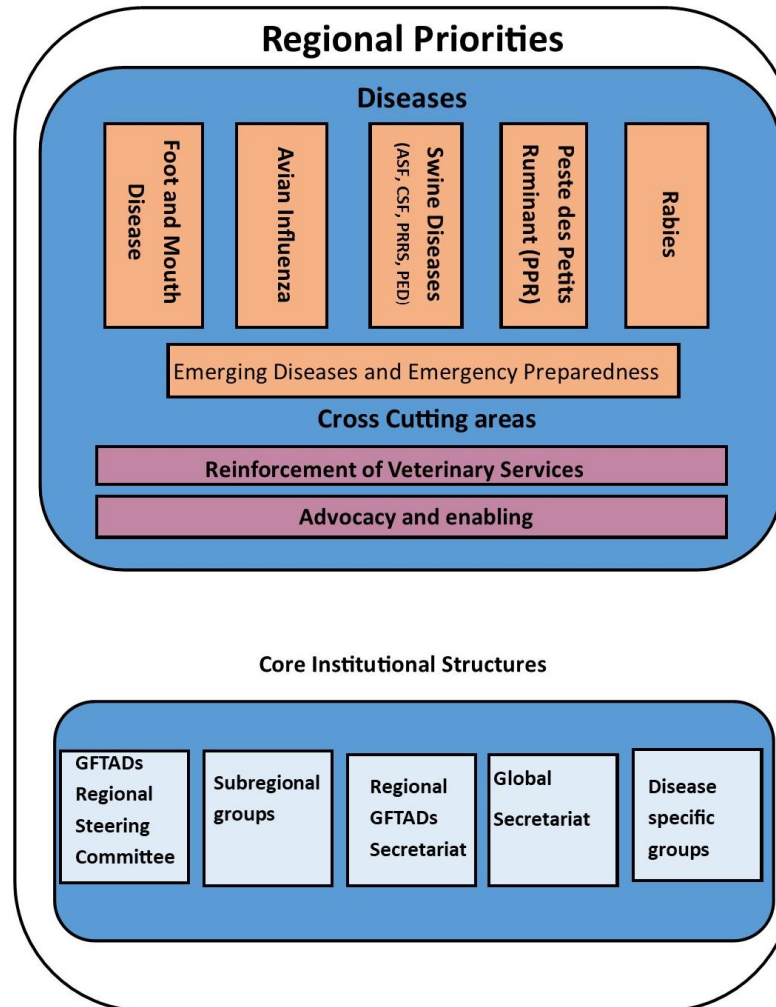
The reinforcement of Veterinary Services
