





Alignment of SEACFMD Campaign with Global Strategy


2012

Risk-based approach to FMD control











- · Fit-for-purpose and sustainable FMD surveillance system established
- · Incentives and pathways of livestock movements understood and official
- Robust vaccination strategy developed, including access to quality vaccines and vaccination data management and analysis
- Preparedness and response capacity to both endemic and new FMD viral strains developed
- · Country ownership of the SEACFMD enhanced
- National VS capacities assessed and recommendations from PVS Evaluations implemented
- National legislation related to FMD (and other related TADs) reviewed and revised
- Multidisciplinary and multisectoral efforts implemented for control of FMD (and other TADs)
- · Cost-efficient synergies with other livestock activities implemented
- · Pool of regional experts actively involved in SEACFMD activities
- ASEAN support reaffirmed, including allocation of appropriate resources
- Regional coordination platforms effectively functioning
- Active collaboration established and maintained with key partners
- · Cooperation with non-SEACFMD member countries established
