The Global Framework for Transboundary Animal Diseases (GF-TADs)

- Joint FAO/WOAH initiative for the fight against TADs, launched in 2004;
- Coordinating mechanism, not an implementing one;
- Global and regional framework in;
 - promoting synergies among international agencies,
 - avoiding contradictions and duplication in policy and programmes

"Regional GF-TADs: 5-year Action Plan 2012-2016"

The vision of GF-TADs is

to reduce the threat from TADs through multi-stakeholder cooperation

"GF-TADs Strategy for 2021-2025"

Global strategy for 2021-2025

- Launched in 2021
- The ultimate goals of this global strategy are
 - to improve food security and nutrition
 - to reduce poverty and
 - to enhance safe trade in livestock and animal products





GF-TADs Strategy for 2021–2025 Enhancing control of transboundary animal diseases for global health



by reducing repeated incursions and the further spread of infectious disease epidemics.

GF-TADs Strategy for 2021–2025 Enhancing control of transboundary animal diseases for global health



Regional GF-TADs Strategy 2023-2027

- Established in-line with Global GF-TADs Strategy
- Guiding document for regional and sub-regional activities (EA, SA, SEA, SPC)
- Adopted by ad-referendum after four rounds of circulation in May 2023
- Three Objectives, 11 expected Outputs and 37 Actions
 - 1. Strategies and mechanism
 - 2. Capacity activities
 - 3. Partnerships
- Annexed with ToR and operational two-year work plan

Objectives and Outputs

Objective 1:Establish strategies for priority TADs at the regional and sub-regional levels

- Output 1.1: TADs prioritisation facilitated/coordinated;
- Output 1.2: Regional and sub-regional TADs control strategies are formulated in alignment with global strategies;
- Output 1.3: Mechanisms for harmonised/coordinated planning established.

Objectives and Outputs

Objective 2: Develop and maintain capacities to prevent and control TADs

- Output 2.1: Capacity gaps are identified and priorities for capacity building are defined;
- Output 2.2: Strengthening capacity of laboratory and epidemiology for prevention and control of TADs;
- Output 2.3 Multi-disciplinary collaboration and coordination for the prevention and control of priority TADs is strengthened;
- Output 2.4: Providing harmonised mechanisms/tools to monitor the control of priority TADs.

Objectives and Outputs

Objective 3: Improve the sustainability of strategies to control priority TADs through multi-disciplinary partnerships

- Output 3.1: Strengthen engagement and coordination with relevant stakeholders, including the private sector;
- Output 3.2: Strengthening coordination amongst FAO and WOAH both at the global and national level;
- Output 3.3: Improve policy dialogue to advocate TADs control for Members;
- Output 3.4: Promote sustainable funding mechanisms.

The 10th RSC meeting (2018)


- Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD): EA, SA, SEA
- Avian Influenza (AI): EA, SA, SEA
- Swine diseases (ASF, CSF, PRRS, PED): EA, SEA
- Peste Des Petits Ruminants (PPR): EA, SA
- Rabies (EA, SA, SEA)
- Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD)?

Regional Strategy 2023-2027

- FMD
- PPR
- ASF and Other Swine Diseases (CSF, PRRS, PED)
- Al
- LSD
- Rabies is mostly dealt within a One Health context through the Quadripartite Mechanism
- Lumpy Skin Disease has spread extensively across the Asia-Pacific Region

Aquatic and Equine Diseases, and laboratory capacity building activities are also covered.

- ✓ Finalise the GF-TADs Regional Strategy 2023-2027 and develops two-year subregional work plans
- Endorses five priority diseases
- Consider GF-TADs coordination mechanism to address other emerging diseases and crosscutting/horizontal issues
- ✓ Integrate TADs prevention and control, and resource mobilization into broader national initiatives
- ✓ Strengthen the role of the Regional Economic Communities

Information sharing on equine diseases and related matters



- Outcomes
- Developing a regional coordination mechanism for international horse movement between the public and private sectors;
- Developing a capacity-building program on equine diseases, WOAH concepts (EDFZ, HHP, Zoning) and emergency preparedness for emerging equine diseases;
- Assessment of laboratory capacity to diagnose equine diseases and building networks between public and private laboratories;
- Facilitation of international sport horse movement through harmonized import health certificates;
- Presentation of project outputs to partners during Regional Workshops /meetings.




