- Nationally-agreed approach for the response to EAD incidents in Australia
- LSD response policy updated and published August 2022
- Policy is to eradicate LSD in the shortest possible time, while minimising social, economic, animal welfare and environmental impacts, using stamping out with or without vaccination.

EADRA

- Nationally agreed arrangements for cost sharing of compensation

Lumpy Skin Disease confirmed in Sumatra, raising alert for Australia

The Indonesian government last night signed off on an Emergency Declaration following confirmation that Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD) has been identified in Sumatra, increasing the risk of the disease entering Australia.

The international animal health agency (OIE) is also being notified.

Lumpy skin disease is a viral disease of cattle and buffalo that can cause painful skin lesions, fever. watery eyes, loss of appetite, and





Lumpy skin disease could reach Australia before foot and mouth disease, with fears the threat is going unnoticed



Expert analysis has warned that lumpy skin disease (LSD) is almost three times more likely to arrive in Australia compared to foot-and-mouth disease but getting barely any national attention compared to the latter.

The Northern Territory's chief vet Sue Fitzpatrick said some scientists believe an LSD outbreak in Australia is inevitable.

"There are other experts that believe that lumpy skin disease, given the patterns of


spread around the world will er timeline for that is unknown, it could be 10 years away," Dr Fitzj




