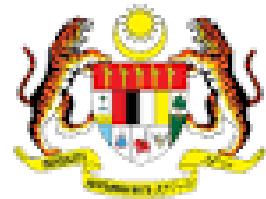

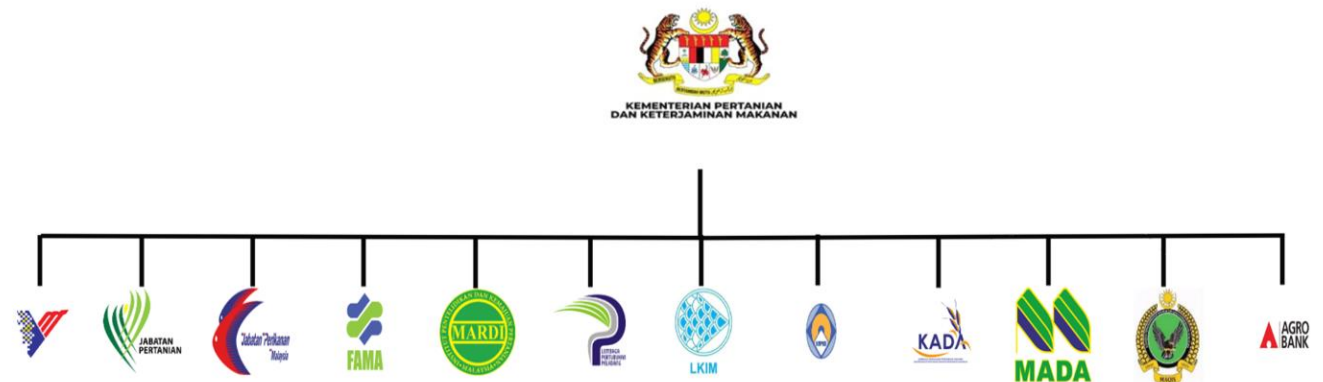
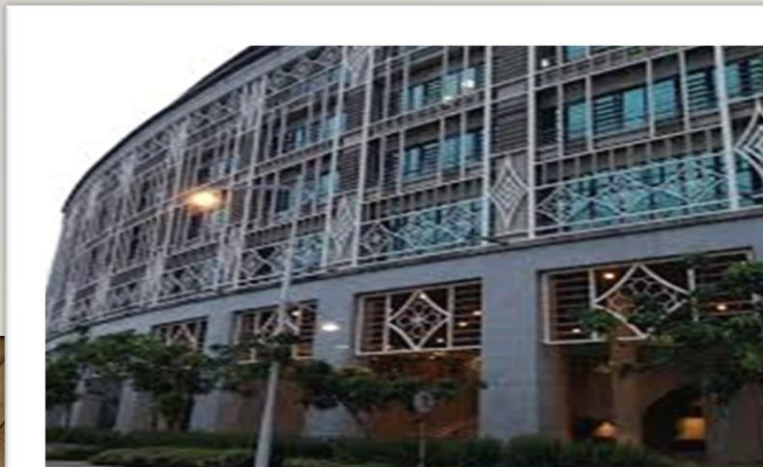


Background of the Department



The Department was first established in 1896 with the original name of the Department of Animal Services and was officially renamed to the Department of Veterinary Services in 2008.

The department is under the Ministry of Agriculture & Food Security and it is the Veterinary Competent Authority of Peninsular Malaysia.





• Roles and responsibilities for imports of animals and animal products

- Import and export control of livestock and animal products
- Inspection of meat, milk, eggs, animal feed, slaughterhouses and animal product processing plants
- DVS is responsible to issue veterinary health certificate. (as stated under the Provisions of Animal Act 1953, Section 16 and to comply to Import Requirements)
- Assurance of the safety of the imported livestock and value-added product
- To achieve and maintain the required standard for livestock and animal-based value-added products.



LEGISLATION

- Animal Act 1953
- Veterinary Doctor Act 1974
- Malaysian Quarantine and Inspection Services Act 2011



FOCAL AGENCIES ON SPS MATTERS

MAFS

- The national focal ministry for SPS matters.
- Coordinate the country's stand and policy with regards to SPS in consultation with other relevant ministries, departments and agencies.

DVS

- The focal agency on animal health.
- Responsible in issuing veterinary health certificate - VHC (as provided under the provisions of Animal Act 1953, Section 16 and to comply to export requirements).

MAQIS

- The focal agency responsible in issuing export and import permit.
- Responsible for quarantine, inspection and enforcement at entry points, quarantine station as stipulated in Malaysian Quarantine and Inspection Services Act 2011, Section 11.



FOCAL AGENCIES ON SPS MATTERS

DOA

- The focal agency on plant health.
- Responsible in issuing phytosanitary certificate for export of plant and plant products.

MOH

- The focal agency on food safety.
- Responsible in issuance of health certificate for export of food.

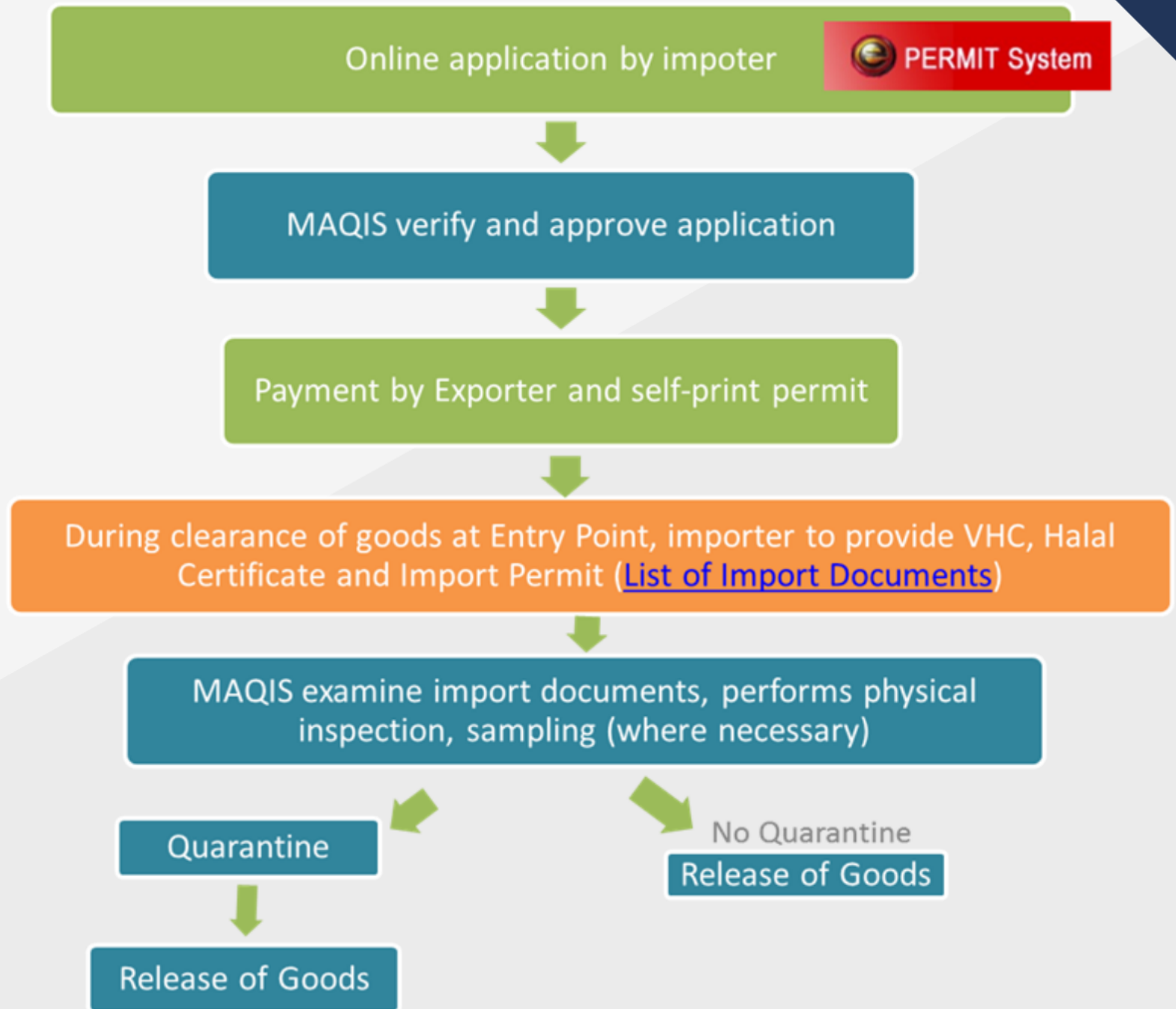

FLOW PROCESS FOR ISSUANCE OF IMPORT PERMIT





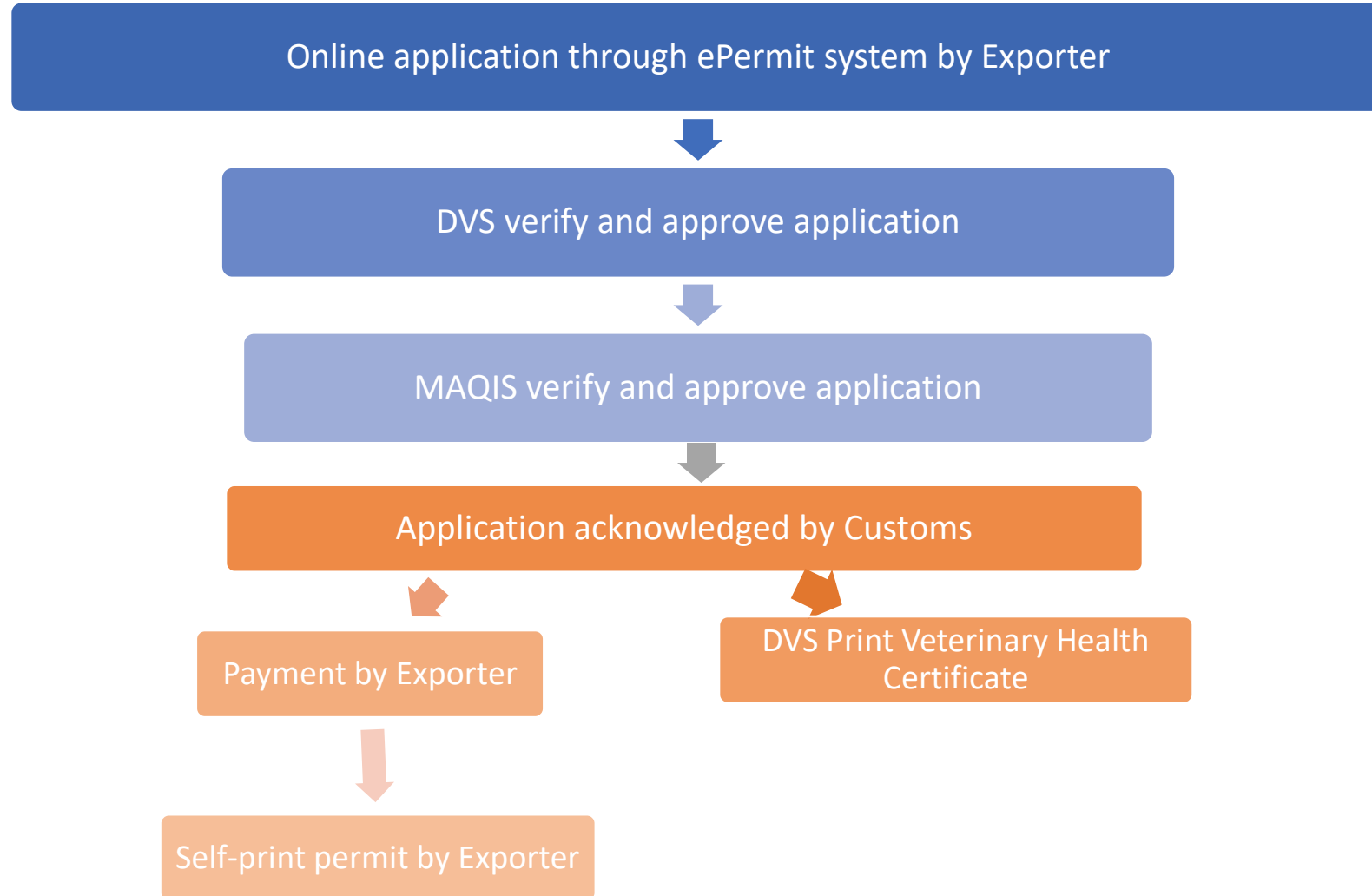
IMPORT DOCUMENTS

Documents are as such:

1. Import Permit (**ORIGINAL PERMIT**)
2. Bil of landing
3. Commercial Invoice
4. Packing List
5. Airway bills
6. Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC)/
Phytosanitation Certificate
7. Animal Feed Board Notification
8. Halal Certificate
9. 3 P Certificate- Will have to undergo compliance inspection
10. CoO – Certificate of Origin

INTRODUCTION OF EPERMIT SYSTEM IN DVS

- In 2009, DVS established ePermit System for online application of:
 - Import Permit
 - Export Permit
 - Veterinary Health Cert



- Online application through the system is **compulsory** for all imports and exports of live animals and animal products.
- Then, the document will be printed and brought along during clearance of goods.

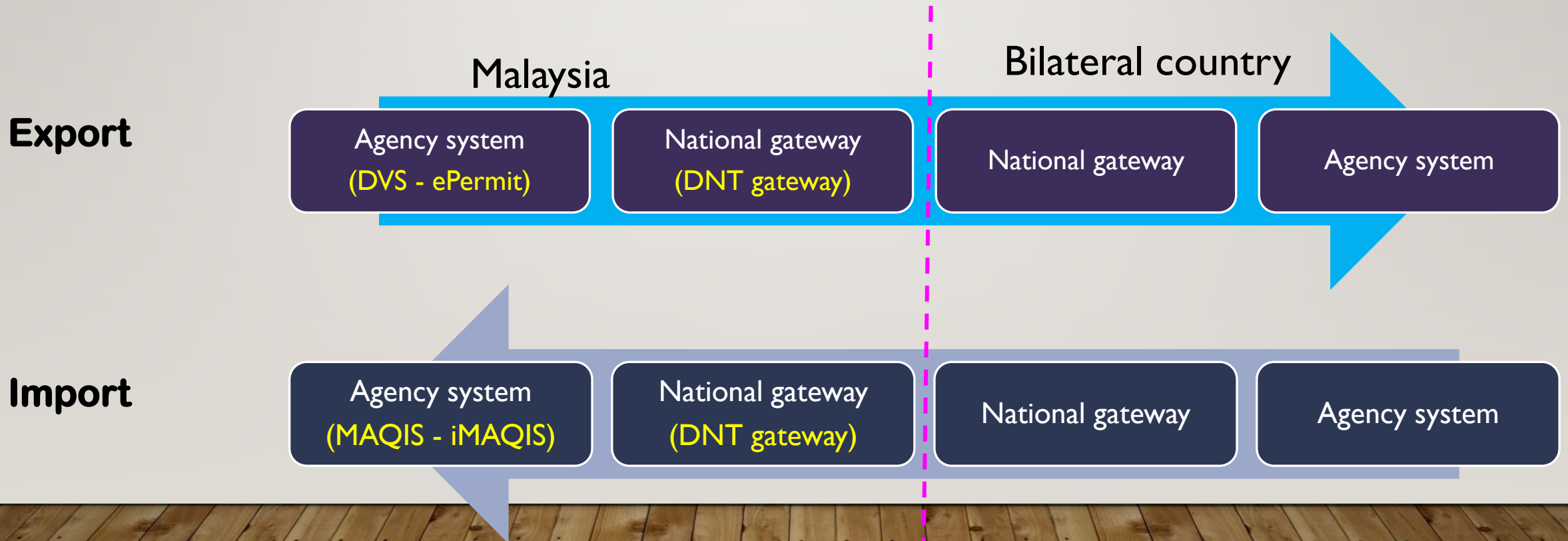
