Terms of Reference for the ASEAN Veterinary Statutory Body Network, AVSBN

VISION:

Strong and committed National Veterinary Statutory Body Authorities and with functional capacity that is anchored through the ASEAN Veterinary Statutory Body Network.

5th OIE Sub-Regional Workshop for Veterinary Educational Establishments and Veterinary Statutory Bodies Pattaya, Thailand, 9-10 November, 2015 and AVCC&VA 2016, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand, 4-6 August, 2016



Objectives:



- 1. To create a regional forum for the National VSBs of ASEAN Member States and equivalent authority (where a National VSB does not exist) for the purpose of sharing information, knowledge and experiences related to the policies, authority and functions of the National VSBs;
- 2. To promote collaboration between ASEAN Member States in supporting the development/establishment of fully functioning National VSBs in Member States currently without VSBs or where VSBs are being developed;
- 3. To mutually support the implementation of international standards related to VSB in ensuring the capacity of National VSBs in promoting good veterinary governance within a country;
- 4. To harmonise the National VSB best practices and operational guidelines, thereby facilitatin transboundary mobility of veterinarians/ veterinary paraprofessionals between ASEAN Member States without prejudice to personalities, religious beliefs, socio-cultural and even political diversities;
- 5. To create links with VSBs/VSB authorities or relevant institutions in other regions for the purpose of exchanging expertise, thereby improving the regional capacity of National VSBs for compliance with international standards.

Goals:

- 1. AVSBN becoming ASEAN Entity Associated officially
- 2. Sharing and harmonization of best practices and operational guidelines of the National VSBs and equivalent authorities of ASEAN Member States (AMS) on Veterinarians and Veterinary paraprofessional MRA
- 3. Supporting the development/establishment of fully functioning National VSBs in AMS currently without/in development, sister VSB program
- 4. Ensuring the capacity of National VSBs in promoting good governance of Veterinary Services (VS) both nationally and regionally by Veterinary Education Establishment Accreditation Standard in South East Asia for the MRA for Veterinary practitioners in ASEAN
- 5. Linkages of AVSBN with VSBs/VSB authorities or relevant institutions in other regions for exchanging expertise, thereby improving the regional capacity of National VSBs for compliance with international standards collaborating with AVBC
- 6. Ensuring the financial support for AVSBN to conduct the activities to meet its objectives



1 - The AVSBN could be considered as an evaluation body similarly to the AVBC to evaluate on behalf of national VSBs regarding accreditation of national VEEs, specialist registrationand qualifying examinations for foreign graduates.





RECOMMENDATIONS








- 2 Curriculum and VEE must meet national standards to be eligible for AVSBN recognition.
- 3 ASEAN veterinary mobility should be tied to VEE accreditation and the accreditation needs to be managed and harmonized across AMS to facilitate regional mobility.
- 4 **SEA VEE accreditation standards** should be established to support improvements in ASEAN veterinary services, enhance the health of animals and the public, protect the safety of food, and promote mobility and trade.














