


WOAH Regional Animal Welfare Strategy (RAWS) for Asia-Pacific

HISTORY: RAWS - first regional animal welfare strategy issued by WOAH.




OBJECTIVE: RAWS - developed to provide an overarching, agreed framework and guidance for WOAH Members, non-WOAH members and Partners in the region when implementing WOAH standards for animal welfare, and to serve as the basis for the development of Action Plans



WOAH (the OIE) first agreed to include animal welfare in its strategy (2001-2005). documents

Third Action Plan (2024 – 2028) of the WOAH Regional Animal Welfare Strategy for Asia and the Pacific

1. Introduction

This is the Third Action Plan issued to support the implementation of the Regional Animal Welfare Strategy (RAWS) for Asia and the Pacific. It was developed following the reactivation of the RAWS Advisory Group (RAWS-AG) for Asia and the Pacific in May 2022.

This Third Action Plan takes account of the needs agreed by World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH) Members of the Regional Commission for Asia Pacific, the outcomes of the implementation of two previous RAWS action plans issued in 2012 and 2015, and the findings of surveys of animal welfare focal points and Delegates in 2019 and 2021. It also incorporates feedback from WOAH Delegates and Animal Welfare Focal Points. The Third Action Plan builds on achievements under the previous two action plans, addresses gaps and updates actions according to current priorities, knowledge and activities.

The intended impact of this Action Plan is enhanced animal welfare alongside progress and socioeconomic development in the region, through a focus on the development and implementation of WOAH animal welfare standards; capacity building and education; and communication to promote respect and awareness of animal welfare.

This Action Plan was developed by the RAWS-AG. The RAWS-AG supports collaboration between regional members and animal welfare stakeholders who share the common vision and support the implementation of activities in this Action Plan. In 2008, the Regional Animal Welfare Strategy (RAWS) for Asia-Pacific was endorsed, serving as a framework crafted by WOAH Members and WOAH Partners to bolster animal welfare alongside socioeconomic development in the region. This strategy centres on the formulation and execution of standards concerning the transport, slaughter, and culling of animals, as well as on capacity building, education initiatives, and communication efforts aimed at fostering respect and awareness for animal welfare.

Introduction

The introduction of African horse sickness (AHS) in Thailand earlier this year drew attention to the importance and relevance of equine species in Asia and the Pacific. The OIE has listed several diseases affecting horses, and developed international recommendations in the format of chapters of the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code, including a specific chapter dedicated to the welfare of working equids. However, in Asia and the Pacific they are not often the focus for transboundary and contagious diseases. With a disease like AHS that is so devastating to horses causing severe illness and with a high mortality rate, the welfare of these animals is a major con-
