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

Progress of the implementation of SEACFMD Roadmap 2021 – 2025 based on M&E indicators




- Baseline M&E indicators

Indicator 1: PCP-FMD stage, progress within a stage or FMD-free status, of each SEACFMD member country, annually.









Output 1.2 Incentives and pathways of livestock movements understood, and official animal movements promoted









Indicator 7: National FMD Plan aligned with the SEACFMD Road Map (2021-2025) that has been endorsed by their Ministries with a budget allocation.









- Once every 3 Months (Quarterly)







Output 2.3 National legislation related to FMD (and other related TADs) reviewed and revised.







Output 2.5 Cost-efficient synergies with other livestock activities implemented



Disease control (PCP-FMD)

Principles, Stage Descriptions and Standards

The Progressive Control Pathway for Foot-and Mouth Disease (PCP-FMD) is stepwise approach to control FMD based on a thorough understanding of the routes of transmission and the impacts of FMD





Stepwise approach (PCP-FMD)

	Stage focus								
Stage 1	Understand the epidemiology of FMD and develop a risk-based approach								
Stage 2	Risk-based measures are implemented and monitored to reduce the impact of FMD in at least one zone or husbandry sector								
Stage 3	Early detection and quick response to reduce outbreak incidence and virus circulation in at least one zone of the country								
Stage 4	The approved Official Control Programme is implemented and monitored								
Status	WOAH free status with vaccination World Organisation								
Status	WOAH free status without vaccination for Animal Health Founded as OIE								


TO PROGRESS TO UPPER STAGES

- 0 → 1: Design a Risk Assessment Plan
- 1 → 2: Design a Risk-Based Strategic Plan
- 2 → 3: Design an Official Control
 Programme aiming at virus
 elimination
- 3 → 4: WOAH endorsement of the Official Control Programme





PCP-FMD Self Assessment Tool



The PCP-FMD Self-Assessment Tool (SAT) was initially developed by WOAH and EuFMD in 2017-18 to assist national Veterinary Services — CVO/Delegates and key national experts - of countries in PCP-FMD Stage 0 to 3 in regularly assessing their progress along the PCP-FMD.

The SAT aims to assist countries to identify completed and pending activities that should be carried out (prioritization) to better understand the FMDV situation and better control FMD. It produces detailed outputs/visuals to guide and facilitate the communication with the relevant decision-makers.

This **NEW** version (2023) of the SAT (**v2**) is being piloted to replace the former SAT.






PCP-FMD Self Assessment Tool

36 Indicators (topics for evaluation)

Total of 4 components:

- Livestock sector and stakeholders
 - 3 categories (Livestock population, Socio-economics, Stakeholders)
- Surveillance and diagnostics
- 3 categories (Surveillance tools and procedures, Data management, Communication)
 - Prevention control and evaluation
- 4 categories (Movement controls, Vaccination, Early warning, Monitoring and Evaluation)
 - Veterinary Services
 - 3 categories (Coordination, Legislation, Professional competency)









Self- assessment Tool for PCP-FMD (member countries)

SATv2 – Updated version: Exercised for the first time in member countries





