




Objective of the Campaign

- Enhanced capacities of veterinary services
- Increasing rural livelihoods from strengthened farm-based economies & safer trading
- Improved transboundary trade of livestock and animal products.



Principles for development of Roadmap







 - WOAH Reference Lab for FMD/ Collaborating Centres
- Steering Committee Member will be Advisory Group to guide Core Group and National Coordinators






Milestones to be achieved by 2030

- By 2030
 - FMD free countries remain free
 - FMD endemic countries reach PCP stage 3 and 4
- Increased involvement of the ASEAN
- Better regulated animal movements
- Development/improvement of animal quarantines facilities / border control
- Increased cooperation with the traders (all traders follow the rules and agreements)
- Extend to other TADs
- Enhanced PPP and more private sector engagement
- More FMD free compartments and zones
- Change the mind of private sectors who have potential to invest in FMD control

Conclusion

- Request Sub-Commission to endorse the Roadmap development modalities;
- Sub-Commission Steering Committee Member from SEACFMD Members to nominate one Technical Officer to the Core Group for development SEACFMD Roadmap 2026 – 2030;
- Core Group to initiate development of new Roadmap in line with proposed actions and timeline in collaboration with National Coordinators
- National Coordinators contribute to development of outline, theory of change and drafting of Roadmap;
- Steering Committee Members will play the role of Regional Advisory Group for the Global FMD Strategy in other sub-regions;
- Sub-Commission Members to provide strategic guidance for the development of new Roadmap.
