




Communication efforts through use of social media i.e. NParks /AVS website, Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, Telegram, Tiktok

Get your cat microchipped by a vet A microchip provides a unique identification code that can be linked to contact details of

Pet Animal Licensing System (PALS)

Keep ALL your existing pet cats

Complete the pet ownership course and have you cat's microchip number on hand before applying

And ensure their health and welfare are taken care of

This may include installing mesh and grilles on

your windows and gates, not allowing your cats

to roam freely, and using a harness or cat carrier

Apply for cat licence on

Complete free online pet ownership course This is a mandatory course for first-time cat and dog




