Dr. Hoet is the founder (2005) and Director of the Veterinary Public Health program at Ohio State University (http://vet.osu.edu/education/veterinary-public-health-program), which is ACVPM accredited and second largest program of its kind in the USA.

He is the Team leader of the <u>WOAH Twinning Program in Ethiopia</u>, helping to create the <u>first WOAH harmonized veterinary curriculum in Africa</u>. Currently, with the support of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), he is helping all 20 veterinary schools in Ethiopia in <u>the implementation of their new national curriculum</u>, launching on May 2025 the <u>Veterinary Education National Action Plan</u> for the 2020 Harmonized Veterinary National Curriculum VEd-NAP 2025-2028.

In 2019, the <u>AID-1C project</u> was expanded to SE Asia, establishing hubs in Thailand, and the Philippines to serve 7 countries in the region, which included multiple curricular assessment workshops involving representatives 41 veterinary schools. These workshops were a part of the <u>Assessment of Day-1 Competencies</u> (<u>AID-1C</u>) methodology that Dr. Hoet developed through the Veterinary Education Twinning Program.
