The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 18th August, 1984, and is hereby published for general information :—

THE INDIAN VETERINARY COUNCIL ACT, 1984
No. 52 of 1984

(18th August, 1984.)

An Act to regulate veterinary practice and to provide, for that purpose, for the establishment of a Veterinary Council of India and State Veterinary Councils and the maintenance of registers of the veterinary practitioners and for matters connected therewith.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the regulation of veterinary practice and to provide, for that purpose, for the establishment of a Veterinary Council of India and State Veterinary Councils and the maintenance of registers of persons qualified to engage in veterinary practice for the whole of India and for matters connected therewith or ancillary thereto;

AND WHEREAS Parliament has no power to make laws for the States with respect to any of the matters aforesaid except as provided in articles 249 and 250 of the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS in pursuance of clause (1) of article 252 of the Constitution, resolutions have been passed by all the Houses of the Legislatures of the States of Haryana, Bihar, Orissa, Himachal Pradesh and Rajasthan to the effect that the matters aforesaid should be regulated in those States by Parliament by law;

Enacted on **8th August 1984** in pursuance of clause (1) of **Article 252** of the Constitution of India



Envisages establishment of the VCI at the Center and State Veterinary Councils in States which adopted the IVC Act and all UTs.



Extends to the all States & UTs



Under IVC Act, 1984 various rules and regulations framed for smooth functioning

Veterinary Council of India (VCI)- Overview

- Statutory Body of Government of India established under IVC Act, 1984**
- COMPOSITION OF THE COUNCIL (27 Members)**
 - ✦ **14 Members** nominated by Central Government as per section 3 (3) of IVC Act
 - ✦ **2 Ex-officio members** - A.H. Commissioner, GOI & Secretary, VCI.
 - ✦ **11 Members Elected** from amongst Registered Vety. Practitioners
- First constituted on **2nd August 1989**
- Receives **100% grants-in-aid** from Central Government

Rules framed under IVC Act, 1984



Section 64 empowers the Central Government to make rules to carry out purposes of the Chapters II, III, IV and V



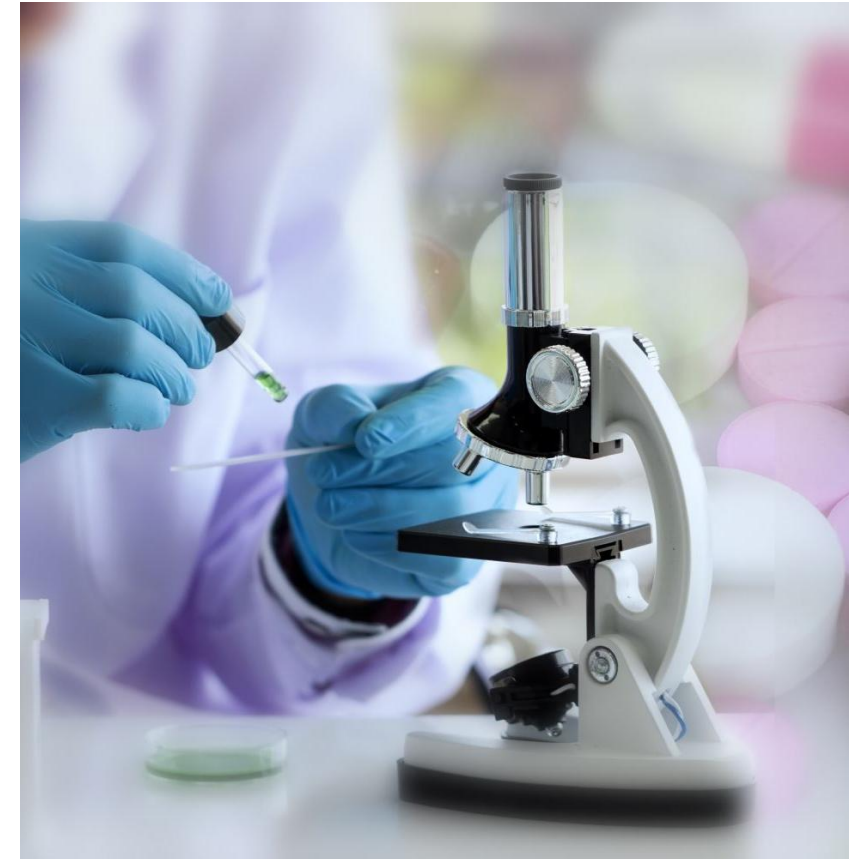
The Central Government framed Indian Veterinary Council Rules, 1985 under Section 64 read with Section 4 prescribing mode of election of members to the Council and amended thereafter.



Veterinary Council of India (Procedure for recognition and de-recognition of Veterinary Colleges and Veterinary Qualifications) Rules, 2017.

Regulations for veterinary education and standards

- Minimum standards for Veterinary Education (BVSc &AH) Course have been notified as “MSVE Regulations 2016” in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 66 read with sub-section (1) of section 22 and clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 21 of the IVC Act, 1984.
- The MSVE defines number of seats, course of study, veterinary curriculum, admission criteria, manpower and infrastructure requirement etc.
- MSVE is under revision for inclusion of new standards and changes in present standards.

Proposed MSVE Regulations

- Presently, MSVE, 2016 is in force. VCI has proposed revision in MSVE.
- Extensive stakeholders consultation

Salient feature of proposed MSVE Regulations

Proposed Regulations have defined standards for 40 to 120 admissions annually

Duration of the course of BVSC &AH spread over five and half professional years consisting of IX semesters of core courses and compulsory "one year" internship consisting of two semester

Universities will strive to set up "Incubation Centre" at the veterinary colleges

Training the students include, besides other aspects of MSVE 2016, awareness on AMR, One health etc.

Ensure that the colleges are equipped fully for NCC, sports activities etc.

Inter University fair/ exhibition to be arranged to show case new technologies.

Explore and encourage MOU with foreign Universities for the student exchange programs.

Provisions to issue detailed guidelines from time to time to strengthen the minimum standards.

Explore and encourage MOU with foreign Universities for the student exchange programs.

Minimum Professional year increased from 210 days to 220 instructional days.

Cont...

National/ International educational tour of 15 days.

TVCC shall also be equipped for and impart training in Veterinary Emergency Response Unit (VEF)

Veterinary colleges shall have facilities for Telemedicine.

Bio-Security and Bio-medical waste Disposal defined in TVCC & ILFC.

Centralized admission/counseling to all veterinary colleges (Public & Pvt.) through centralized process prescribed.

"Professors of Practice" concept shall be compulsorily introduced for imparting practical knowledge and skill to graduate students.

Day -1 competency defined for the B.V.Sc & A.H programme.

Introduced course on Integrative Veterinary Medicine, Principle, Common Formulations and use of Ayurveda and Homeopathy in animals.
