### **INTRODUCTION:**







"ANIMAL"

means a mammal, reptile, bird or bee.

"POUTRY"

"WILD ANIMAL"

"WILDLIFE"



Animal Epidemic Act. B.E. 2558 (2015)

### "ANIMAL"

refers to mammals and poultry, including their reproductive materials such as semen, embryos, and eggs. and other animals as designated by ministerial notification

"the listed animal in the Act.

will be listed by the order or family of species"

### "CARCASS"

means a body or part of a body of a dead **listed animal** or anything derived from living or dead animals, and shall include **cooked food** comprised of, made or prepared from carcasses, or finished artificial items made from carcasses as prescribed in the Notifications by the Minister

- 1. Live animal and inedible animal product: Animal Quarantine Station (veterinarians) response for Health certificate, export permit issuing, and export inspection.
- 2. Edible product: Bureau of Livestock Standard and Certification response on Health certificate and product inspection, Additionally, Animal Quarantine Station (veterinarians) response for export permit issuing.

### Sanitary Certification and Compliance

### As the EXPORTING country:

- We mainly comply with the **destination** countries' import requirements.





The procedures for export certification are as follows:

### 1. Product Inspection and Health Marking:

 Products are inspected and approved for export by the DLD inspector onsite, with a health mark displayed on the product carton.

### 2. Issuance of Form BLSC 1:

 The official veterinary inspector issues Form BLSC 1, certifying the products for export. The original Form BLSC 1 is submitted to the DLD Quarantine Section at the port of exit to obtain export permission (Form R9).

### 3. Loading and Documentation:

 Products for export are loaded into shipping containers under the supervision of the DLD inspector. The details of the exported products are recorded in the Checklist of Product Items in Container form, and the traceability of the exported products is documented in the Meat Traceability form.

### 4. Submission to the Bureau of Livestock Standards and Certification:

The exporter submits copies of Form BLSC 1, Form R9, the Checklist of Product Items in Container, and the Meat Traceability form to the Bureau of Livestock Standards and Certification at the DLD headquarters to receive the Health Certificate for the exported consignment.






Identification/Health Mark

### Sanitary Certification and Compliance (Cont.)



### As the importing country:

We require the Health Certificate which is complilance with our **import requiremnt** and bilateral **health certificate** agreement.

- Import requirement and Health Certification\*\* according to WOAH terrestial-
- **SECTION: 5**. TRADE MEASURES, IMPORT/EXPORT PROCEDURES AND VETERINARY CERTIFICATION
- **SECTION: 6.** VETERINARY PUBLIC HEALTH
- And other relevant section.

### Sanitary Certification and Compliance (Cont.)

- Traceability:
- E-movement system: control animal and animal product movement (both domestic and international movement)
- 2. DLD e-Regist system: was established by the Information and Communication Technology Center (ICT) under DLD in 2010 for the registration of animals in herds or farms throughout the country to be used as a database system for farmers in the country
- 3. National Livestock Identification and Registration System (NID): for individual farm animal identification

### Trade Negotiation and Market Access Efforts

- Agencies involved in negotiation
- CVO of exporting country
- Department of Livestock Development
- Market Access committee
- Import Risk Analysis committee
- Process to initiate and respond to trade requests
- Procedure for import of live animals and/or animal products into the Kingdom of Thailand
- Successful market access
- Export pet food to EU
- Export poultry meat to many countries

CVO of exporting country shall send an official requested letter to export live animals and/or animal products to Director General of DLD. The request shall be considered by Market Access committee. DLD will sending questionnaire to evaluate animal health/public health. The completed questionnaire shall be submitted to Food Safety and Risk Assessment Committee, and Experts on Livestock Development for a Specific Animal Type for risk assessment. Unsatisfied Satisfied Satisfied 4.2 DLD will request for additional 4.1 DLD will notify result of questionnaire reviewing information. DLD inspector team will conduct an inspection audit to the establishment after preonsite questionnaire has been completed. The DLD auditor team shall submit the audit report to the Market Access committee for consideration. Satisfied DLD shall send the improved import Requirements to CVO of exporting country. The CVO of exporting country shall send draft Health Certificate/Electronic health certificate in compliance with the import Requirements to be approved by DLD. formally submit the detail of country approved farms/establishments on DLD website.
