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



## 60 days

Live animals

Animal feeds and feed ingredients; feed additives and supplements, and other feed products; animal premixes and drinking water medication

## 90 days

Animal products and by-products; meat and meat by-products; other products of animal origin (embryos & semen); eggs


















## PROCEDURE FOLLOWED UPON ARRIVAL OF MEAT COMMODITIES

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SUBMIT DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS

Preliminary border inspection thru a sensory-based examination in FIRST BORDER

if there are SPS-related violations:

Notice of Violation (NOV) addressed to BAI Director

Cc: BOC and importer's authorized representative

#### Challenges and Good Practices as an Importing Country

Challenges	Good Practices	
Illicit Trade	Strengthened coordination with Local Government Units and Philippine Coast Guard; Joint Physical Inspection of all imported agri-fishery commodities at the POE and licensed Cold Storage Warehouse; Issuance of Notice of Violation	
Resource Limitations	Leverage partnerships with development partners (FAO, other NGOs) for technical and financial support	
Insufficient Government – Owned Live Animal Quarantine Facilities	Implementation of Quarantine Site Inspection prior to issuance of SPS Import Clearance	
	Active collaboration with exporting countries, including conduct of study tours and DA Inspection Missions as pre-border measures	
	Regular monitoring of the WOAH – WAHIS for disease events	
	Digitalization of Trade-related Processes (Online application system SPSIC)
