

# **Objective 2: Evaluation of SEACFMD Campaign to address Critical Gaps**





### **Critical Gaps and recommended solutions**

Multi-disciplinary and multi sectorial efforts critical for control of FMD & relevant TADs.
Public-Private-Partnerships to build resilience and sustainable control of FMD & other TADs

Sufficient capacity including legislative support, resources and clear incident command system required to respond to health emergencies

Insufficient private sector participation and engagement

Inadequate preparedness to respond to FMD incursion and emerging TADs

Strengthen the regional biosecurity through elimination of informal cross border movement of livestock & products; effective border controls and quarantine facilities.

Inadequate Political Commitment

Critical Gaps

Weak regional biosecurity systems

Advocacy and other interventions to secure policy makers support for successful implementation of SEACFMD campaign.

Lack of surveillance capacity

Enhance capacity to diagnose and detect FMDV including development of lab diagnostic capacity, sampling FMDV Serotyping etc

Access to quality vaccines

Ensuring access to quality vaccines and addressing the challenges in implementing effective vaccination strategies



### 26th SEACFMD National Coordinators Meeting at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (Aug 2024)

- Map FMD risk pathways with FMDV lineages present in the region along the value chains;
  - On going
- Conduct a study of ruminant transportation routes in Southeast Asia and China, incorporating various strategies to enhance safe livestock trade;
  - > TOR developed and circulated to the Members for feedback
- Collate regional information regarding FMD vaccine use in SEACFMD Members including submission of Annual vaccination reports by the Members with information on doses of vaccines produced/ procured, vaccination conducted; and vaccination maps describing (i) blanket (prophylactic) vaccination and (ii) targeted (suppressive) vaccination at different administrative levels;
  - >FMD vaccination study and Annual FMD Vaccination Report





# 26<sup>th</sup> SEACFMD National Coordinators Meeting at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (22 to 24 Aug 2024)

- Develop risk communication materials for FMD targeting traders and members to disseminate FMD communication materials (including newly developed and translated digital materials) to the targeted stakeholders to enhance awareness on FMD prevention and control;
  - >Translation of digitized communication materials into local languages
- Conduct workshop on safe trade to exchange knowledge and understanding of the role of WOAH international standards, the role of importing and exporting countries and SPS market access requirements;
  - **≻**Completed
- Support development of FMD Risk-based strategic plan for Cambodia
  - **≻**Ongoing





### 27th SEACFMD Sub-Commission Meeting at Bangkok, Thailand in September 2024

- NOTES the spread of FMD through animal movement, including the trans-regional spread of emerging FMD virus strains; and RECOMMENDS WOAH SRRSEA to carry out animal movement study in the Greater Mekong region; which may be expanded to include other parts of the region. This will inform risk assessment, surveillance and regulatory activities;
  - >TOR for the study developed and circulated to Members for feedback
- ENCOURAGES Members continue to closely liaise with other border control agencies such as Customs, Police, Trade etc who are involved in regulating the entry of animals and livestock products into the country;
- AGREED to revise the emergency preparedness plan and protocols based on risks and WOAH standards; and to CONDUCT cross-border simulation exercise in the island of Borneo:
  - ➤ Regional Cross-border simulation exercise planned in Borneo Island






### 27th SEACFMD Sub-Commission Meeting at Bangkok, Thailand in September 2024

- AGREED to strengthen existing networks such as Upper Mekong Working Group and initiate other sub-regional collaborations such as Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia and the Philippines (BIMP) collaboration and REACTIVATE Malaysia, Thailand and Myanmar (MTM) collaboration initiative
  - >TOR for MTM initiative developed and cluster approach proposed in new Roadmap
- AGREED to update the SEACFMD Communication Strategy to make it fit for purpose for the Members; in addition, WOAH to SUPPORT Members to develop National Communication Plan/Strategy for FMD and other TADs control;
  - ➤ Revision of SEACFMD Com Strategy initiated; and WOAH will support Members in coming up with National Com Strategy/ Plan
