



The official currency of Indonesia is the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). As of 14 September 2025, the exchange rate is approximately 1 USD = IDR 16,416.

In Jakarta, the average temperature in September typically ranges from around 33°C (91°F) during the day to 25°C (77°F) at night. Rainfall is moderate, averaging about 62 mm over the month. Overall, September is considered a pleasant time to visit the city, with a balance of sunny days and occasional showers.

Electricity in Jakarta operates at 230 V with a frequency of 50 Hz. The standard plug type is Type C (see picture below). Travellers are advised to bring a suitable adapter or conversion plug if required.

If you have specific dietary restrictions—such as allergies, religious requirements, vegetarian, or vegan—please kindly arrange your own meals in advance or you may inform the organisers in advance, so we can do our best to accommodate your requests accordingly. 

#### **SHOPPING MALL**

#### • Grand Indonesia

(6,0 km/20 minutes drive)

Grand Indonesia is an <u>integrated multipurpose complex</u> at <u>Thamrin Road</u> in <u>Central Jakarta</u>, Indonesia. It is located near the <u>Selamat Datang Monument</u>. It became the 4th largest mall in Indonesia. There is also Galeri Indonesia Kaya inside the mall that showcases the Indonesian culture and biodiversity, which is located at at the 8th floor of the West Mall.

#### Plaza Indonesia

It is located beside Grand Indonesia, at the corner of one of the landmarks of Jakarta, <u>The Selamat Datang</u> (<u>Welcome</u>) <u>Monument</u>. #### Pacific Place

The Pacific Place Jakarta is a multipurpose building located in the <u>Sudirman Central Business District</u>, <u>South Jakarta</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>. The building is divided into three different sections: the six-floor Pacific Place Mall, the One Pacific Place Office Center, <u>The Ritz-Carlton Pacific Place</u> hotel, ballroom, and service apartment, and Pacific Place Residence. In January 2017 was recognized by <u>Forbes</u> as one of the top shopping malls in Jakarta.

#### · National Monument of Indonesia

(1,2 km/ 5 minutes drive/ 11 minutes walk)

The National Monument (Monas) is a 132-meter (433-foot) obelisk standing tall at the heart of Merdeka Square in Central Jakarta. Built to honor Indonesia's fight for independence, it features a golden flame at the top, symbolizing the unwavering spirit of the Indonesian people. The monument and its museum are open to the public daily from 08:00 to 16:00 Western Indonesia Time (UTC+7), except on Mondays when it's closed. Since April 2016, Monas also welcomes visitors at night: from 19:00 to 22:00 on Tuesdays to Fridays, and from 19:00 until midnight on Saturdays and Sundays.

The National Museum of Indonesia (Indonesian: Museum Nasional archeological, Indonesia) is an historical. ethnological, geographical museum located in Jalan Medan Merdeka Barat, Central Jakarta, right on the west side of Merdeka Square. The museum has endeavoured to preserve Indonesia's heritage for two centuries. The museum is regarded as one of the most complete and the best in Indonesia, as well as one of the finest museums in Southeast Asia. The museum has preserved about 141,000 objects, ranging from prehistoric artifacts to archeology, numismatics, ceramics, ethnography, history and geography collections. It has comprehensive collections of stone statues of the classical Hindu-Buddhist period of ancient Java and Sumatra as well as quite extensive collections of Asian ceramics.

Kota Tua Jakarta (<u>Indonesian</u> for "Jakarta Old Town"), officially known as Kota Tua is a neighborhood comprising the original downtown area of <u>Jakarta</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>. The site contains <u>Dutch-style structures</u> mostly dated from 17th century, when the port city served as the Asian headquarters of <u>VOC</u> during the heyday of <u>spice trade</u>. The largely Chinese downtown area of <u>Glodok</u> is a part of Kota Tua.

#### Istiqlal Mosque and The Jakarta Cathedral

Istiqlal Mosque (Indonesian: Masjid Istiqlal) in Jakarta, Indonesia is the largest mosque in Southeast Asia and the ninth largest mosque in the world in terms of worshipper capacity. Built to commemorate Indonesian independence, this national mosque of Indonesia was named "Istiqlal", an Arabic word for "independence". The mosque was opened to the public on 22 February 1978. Within Jakarta, the mosque is positioned next to Merdeka Square, the Jakarta Cathedral (Catholic). Jakarta Cathedral (Indonesian: Gereja Katedral Jakarta) is a Latin Catholic cathedral in Jakarta, Indonesia, which is also the seat of the Archbishop of Jakarta, currently Archbishop Ignatius Suharyo Hardjoatmodjo. This current cathedral was consecrated in 1901 and built in the neo-Gothic style, a common architectural style to build churches at that time.



### All Indonesia Arrival Card





Complete your Arrival Card online before travelling. Required for all incoming passengers to Indonesia.



"All Indonesia Arrival Card" is a unified digital form that combines several previous arrival/declaration forms (immigration, customs, health, etc.) into one. The form replaces earlier separate processes such as SATUSEHAT (health declaration) and e-CD (customs declaration) for international travellers.

After you submit it online, you will receive a QR code via email. On arrival at an international entry point, you present this QR code along with your passport.

#### Who Needs to Fill It Out?

- 1. All international travellers arriving in Indonesia (airports, and soon at all international entry points). This includes tourists, business travellers, etc.
- 2. Indonesian citizens returning from abroad also must complete it.
- 3. Include children and infants each person must have their own card.

#### When & Where to Fill It Out?

- 1. The card must be submitted within 3 days (i.e. 72 hours) before you arrive in Indonesia.
- 2. It is free of charge.
- 3. It is done via the official website: allindonesia.imigrasi.go.id.
- 4. Available in English (select "English") and also for "Foreign Visitor" if you are not an Indonesian citizen.

What information or requirements do you need to have before you start filling out the form? Prepare the following items so you can complete it smoothly:

#### Information / Document Required:

- 1. Passport details: Passport number, nationality, date of issue & expiry, name, date of birth.
- 2. Contact info: your email and phone number (ensure correct; QR code will be sent to your email).
- 3. Travel details: Arrival date, departure date, visa status (if you already have an e-visa / visa / KITAS / etc), flight or ship info.
- 4. Transport & accommodation: Name of airport/port of arrival, flight number, hotel name and address or place where you will stay.
- 5. Health & customs declarations: Recent travel history (countries visited in last 21 days, etc.), any health symptoms, items to declare (electronics, large amounts of cash, animals, certain foods, etc.), number of luggage pieces. Additionally, IMEI registration for mobile devices may be required.

### All Indonesia Arrival Card







- 1. Go to the website: allindonesia.imigrasi.go.id
- 2. Set the site language to English (there should be an option) if you don't read Indonesian.
- 3. Select your category: Foreign Visitor or Indonesian Citizen, depending on your status.
- 4. Fill in the personal details (name, nationality, passport info, contact).
- 5. Fill in travel & stay details (arrival date, departure date, flight, hotel/accommodation).
- 6. Fill in health declaration & customs declaration questions. These are typically yes/no, and possibly specifying items or symptoms.
- 7. Review all information carefully before submitting. Mistakes in passport number, dates, etc., could cause delays.
- 8. Submit; then check your email for the QR code. Save it (on your phone) or print a copy.
- 9. On arrival at the entry point, present the QR code and your passport at immigration/customs.

#### **Some Important Notes / Tips**

- The "All Indonesia Arrival Card" does not replace your visa. You still need the proper visa or visa exemption as applicable.
- Make sure your passport has at least 6 months of validity, because many airlines/immigration check this. (This is a general Indonesian requirement)
- Ensure your return or onward ticket is available, because immigration may ask for it.
- Submit the form well ahead of time (within 72 hours, ideally a day or two before you fly), so you have time in case of issues.
- Use only the official government portal avoid third-party sites that may charge or collect data improperly.

# How to Get and Use an eSIM in Indonesia



- 1. Check Compatibility
- 2. Make sure your smartphone supports eSIM (most recent iPhone, Samsung, Google Pixel, and other newer models do).
- 3. Buy an eSIM Plan
  - Before arrival: You can buy an international eSIM online from providers like Airalo, Holafly, Nomad, etc. and activate it right away when you land in Indonesia.
  - After arrival: You can also buy a local eSIM from Indonesian providers such as Smartfren, Telkomsel, Indosat, or XL (available at airports, malls, or app stores).
- 4. Get Your QR Code
- 5. After purchase, you will receive a QR code by email, app, or directly from the provider.
- 6. Activate the eSIM
  - Go to your phone settings → Cellular / Mobile Data.
  - Select Add eSIM or Add Mobile Plan.
  - Scan the QR code.
- 7. Connect and Use
- 8. Once activated, your phone will connect to the Indonesian network. You can start using mobile data, calls, and texts.
- Tip: You can keep your original SIM card active for receiving messages (like WhatsApp or bank codes), and use the eSIM for local data in Indonesia.



#### 1. Hotels & Accommodation

- Most hotels, hostels, and guesthouses provide free WiFi.
- Quality can vary, so don't rely on it for work calls or heavy streaming.
- 2. Cafés & Restaurants
  - Popular coffee chains (e.g., Starbucks, Excelso, Kopi Kenangan) and many restaurants offer free WiFi.
  - Smaller local places may not always have WiFi.
- 3. Shopping Malls & Airports
  - Major airports (Jakarta, Bali, Surabaya) and big shopping malls usually have free WiFi.
  - Some require registration with a local phone number
