
SEACFMD Roadmap 2026 – 2030 (7th Phase – New Era of the SEACFMD Campaign)

Goal:

To achieve regional control and eradication of FMD, through strengthened veterinary services and regional collaboration.

The achievement of the goal will be indicated by:

- For SEACFMD Members with FMD free status Successful maintenance of their country's and zones' FMD-free status;
- For SEACFMD Members with endemic FMD areas:
 Demonstrated progress along the FMD Progressive Control Pathway;
- Increased number of disease-free zones endorsed by WOAH and/ or trading partners







Outcomes and Outputs

- 1. FMD control enhanced through risk-based strategies, supporting PCP-FMD progress and maintaining FMD-free zones
- 1.1: Fit for purpose FMD surveillance system strengthened
- 1.2: Strengthened veterinary laboratory diagnostic system
- 1.3: Improved livestock movement control, quarantine and biosecurity
- 1.4. Enhanced FMD vaccination and access to quality vaccine


