This symposium brings together participants from all over Asia into Singapore, to discuss their actions and aspirations for biodiversity. The theme for World Wildlife Day Regional Youth Symposium 2026 is “Exploring Intersections Among Wildlife Trade, Wildlife Health, and Wildlife Conservation”. This symposium brings together youths from Southeast Asia and the wider Asia region into Singapore with the following aims:

1. Spotlight Wildlife Trade, Wildlife Health, and Wildlife Conservation in Asia, and show how these topics are interconnected
2. Anchor and grow the youth wildlife network in Asia
3. Connect youths with mentors and role models in the wildlife sector
4. Encourage environmental stewardship, protecting nature for future generations

The symposium will comprise of speaker talks and panel discussions on 28 March, followed by a morning workshop and afternoon showcase of youth-led projects on 29 March. More details on the programme outline will be provided in the near future.
