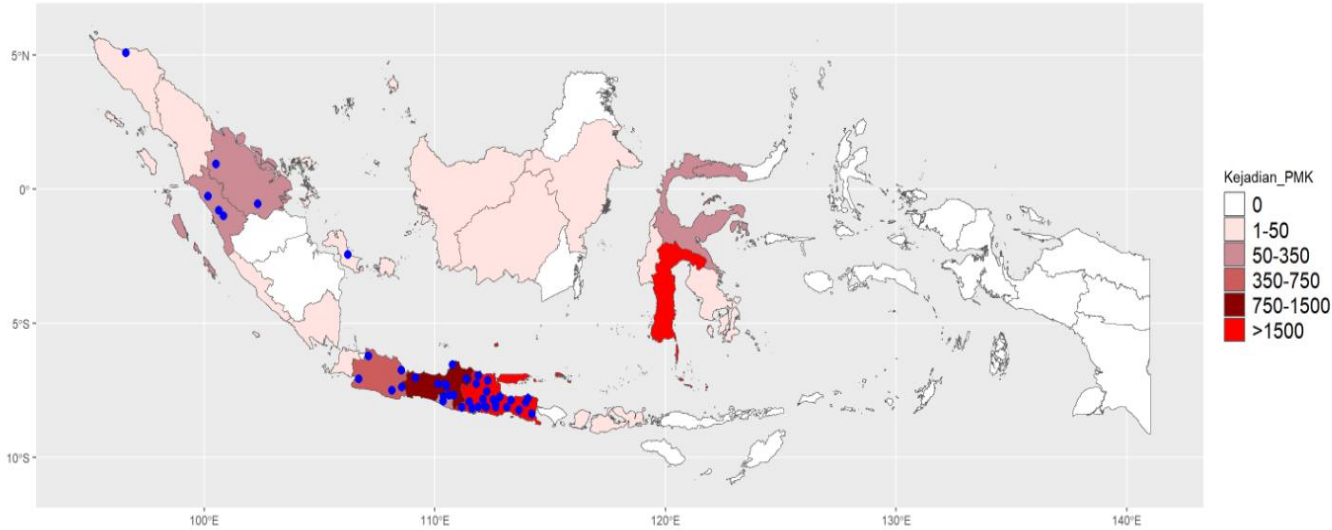

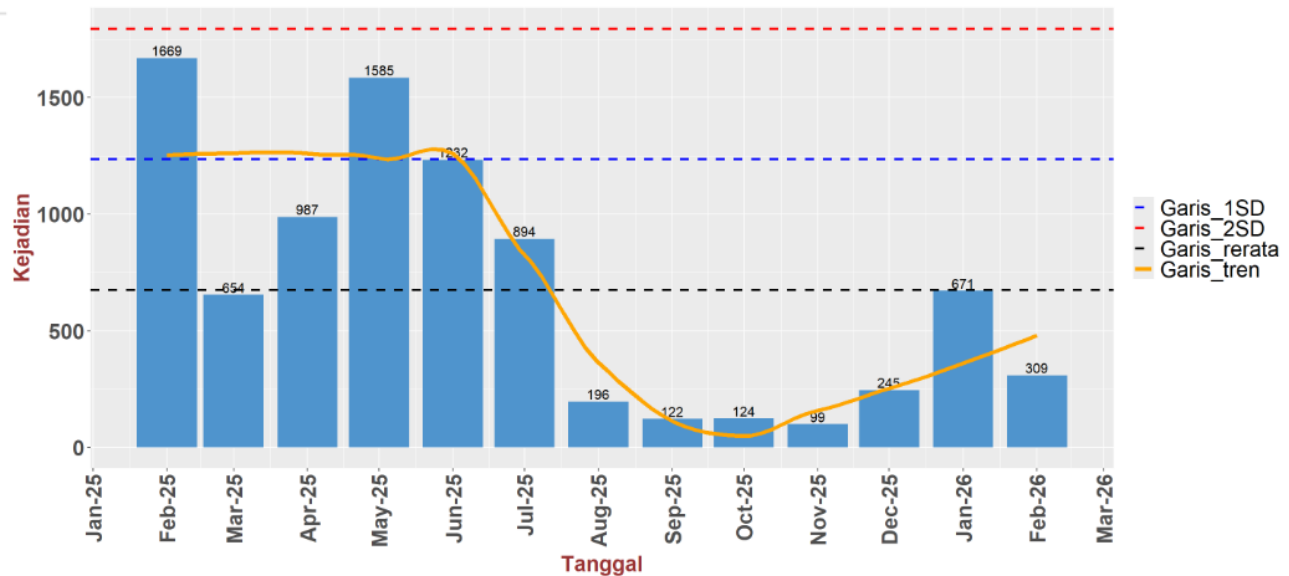

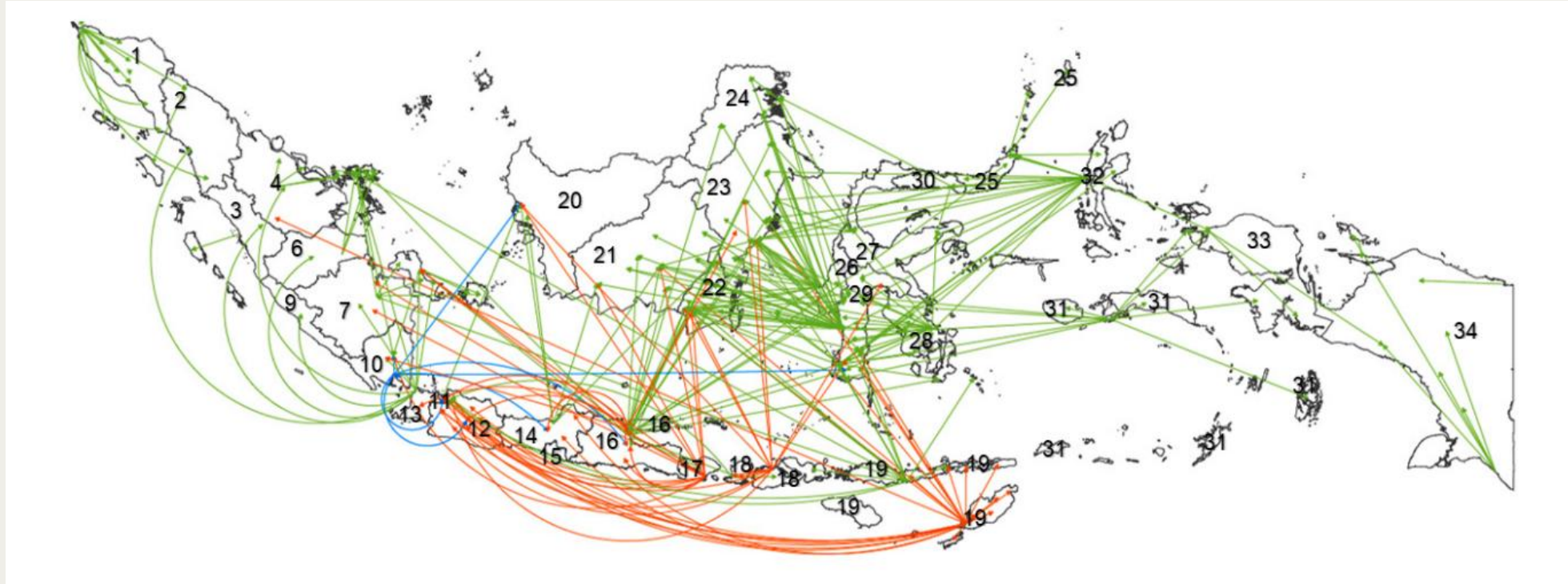
FMD Situation in Indonesia (2025-2026)

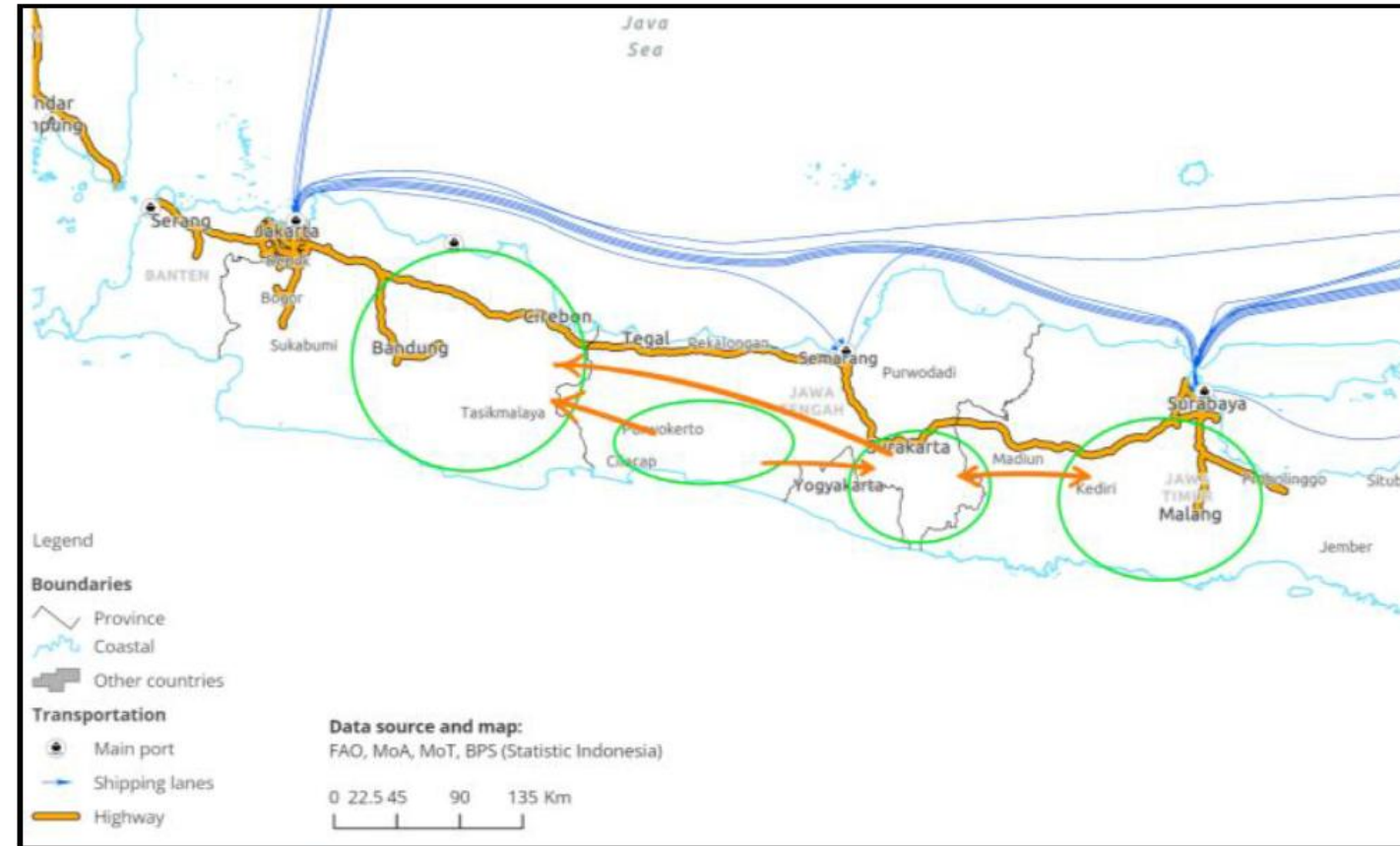


Fig 2. Dairy cattle movements within Java Island

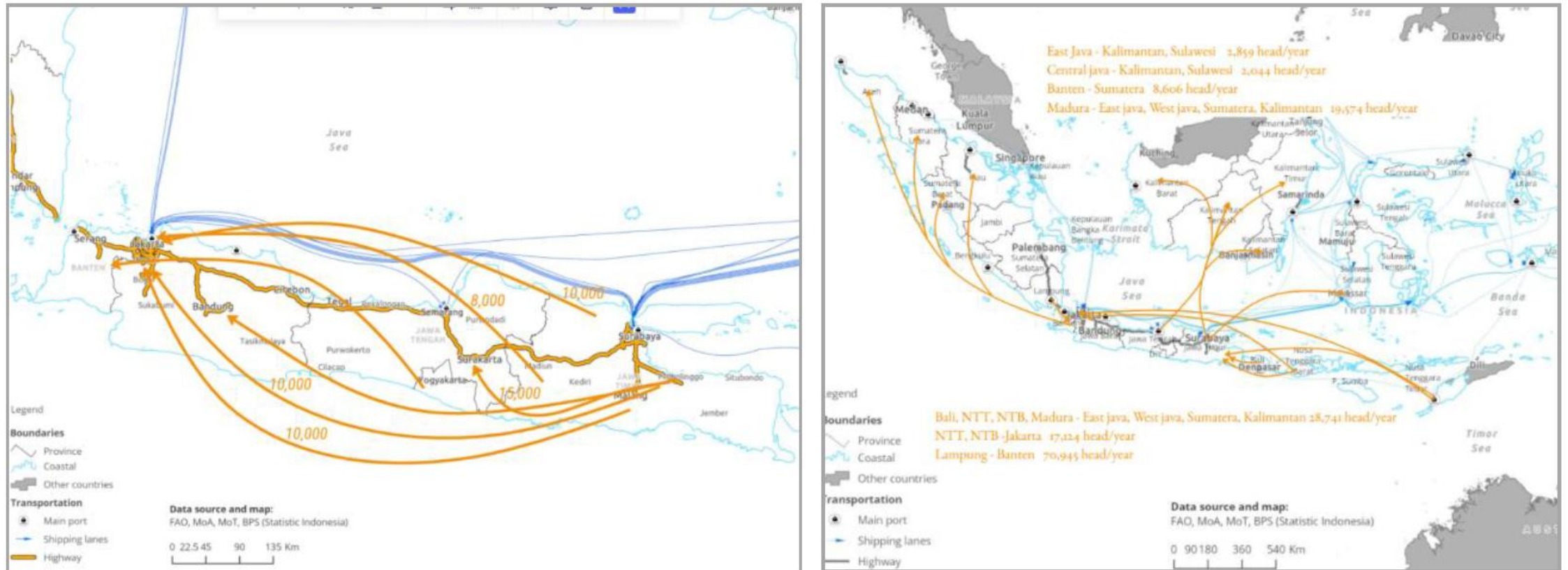


Fig 4. Beef cattle movements from/to Java Island

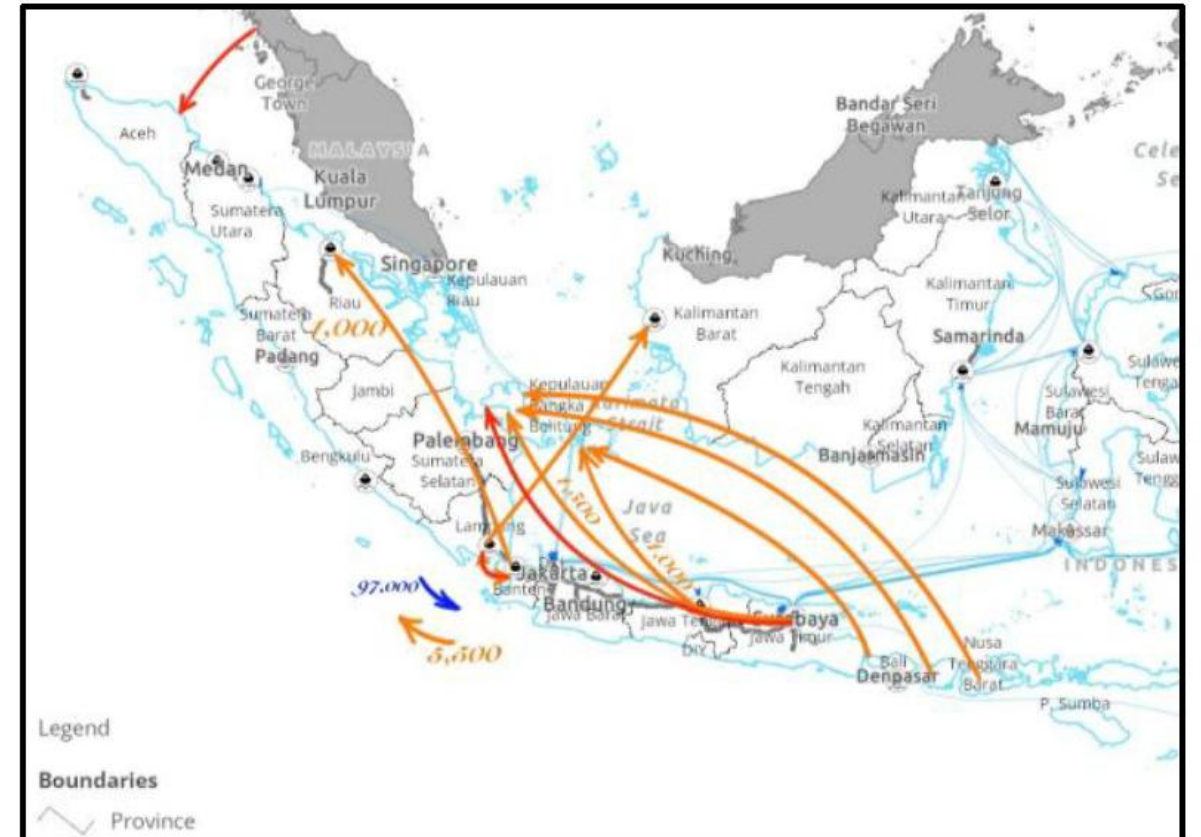


Fig 6. Beef cattle movements in Sumatera Island (left: within; right: to/from)

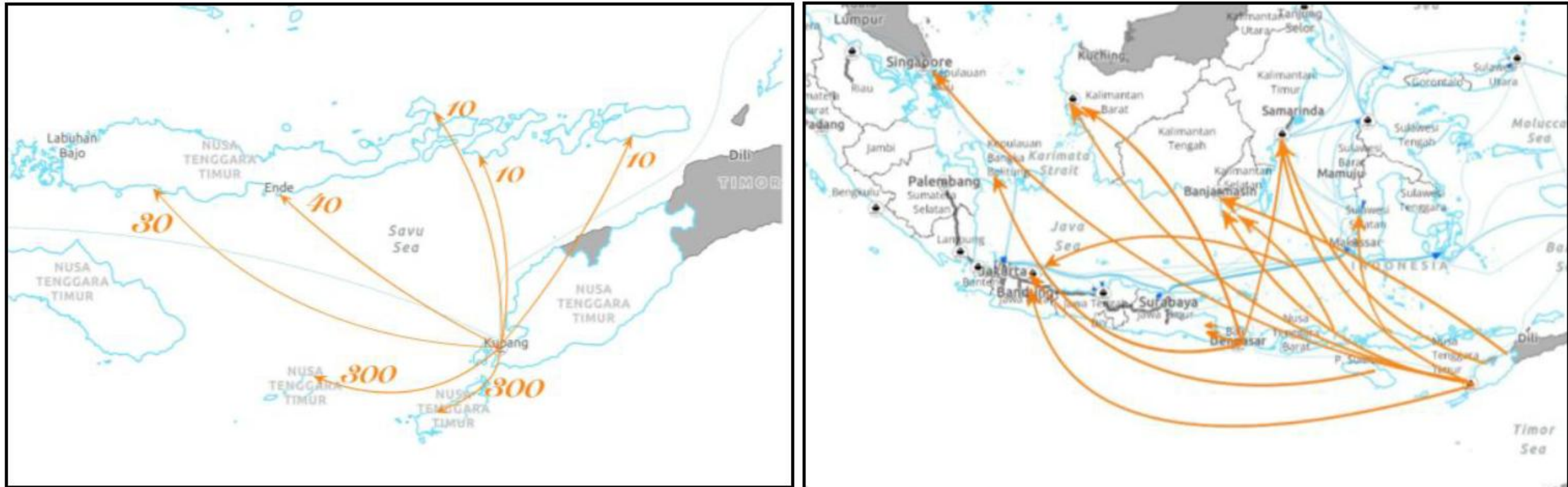


Fig 8. Beef cattle movements in Nusa Tenggara Timur (left: within; right: to/from)

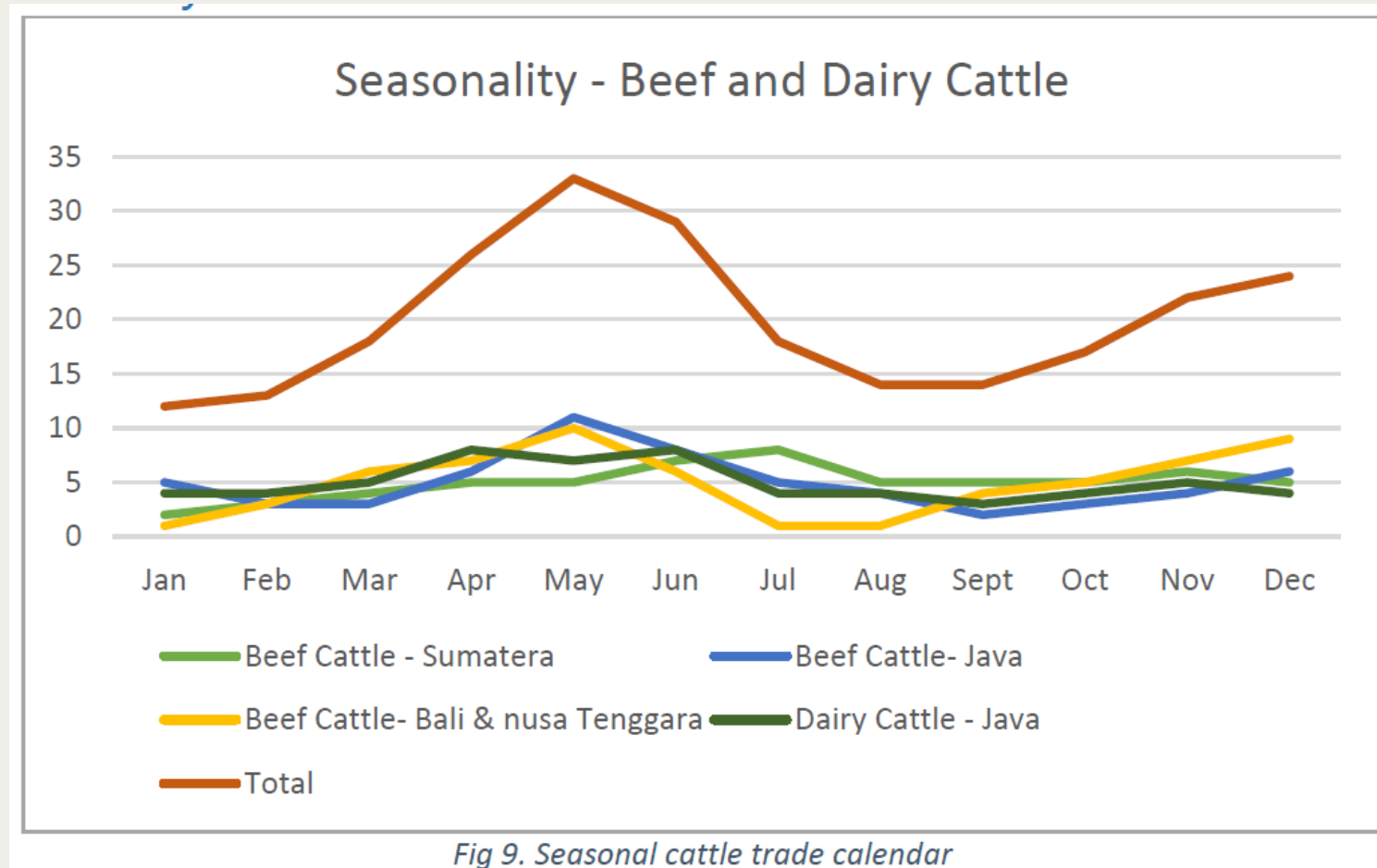


Fig 9. Seasonal cattle trade calendar

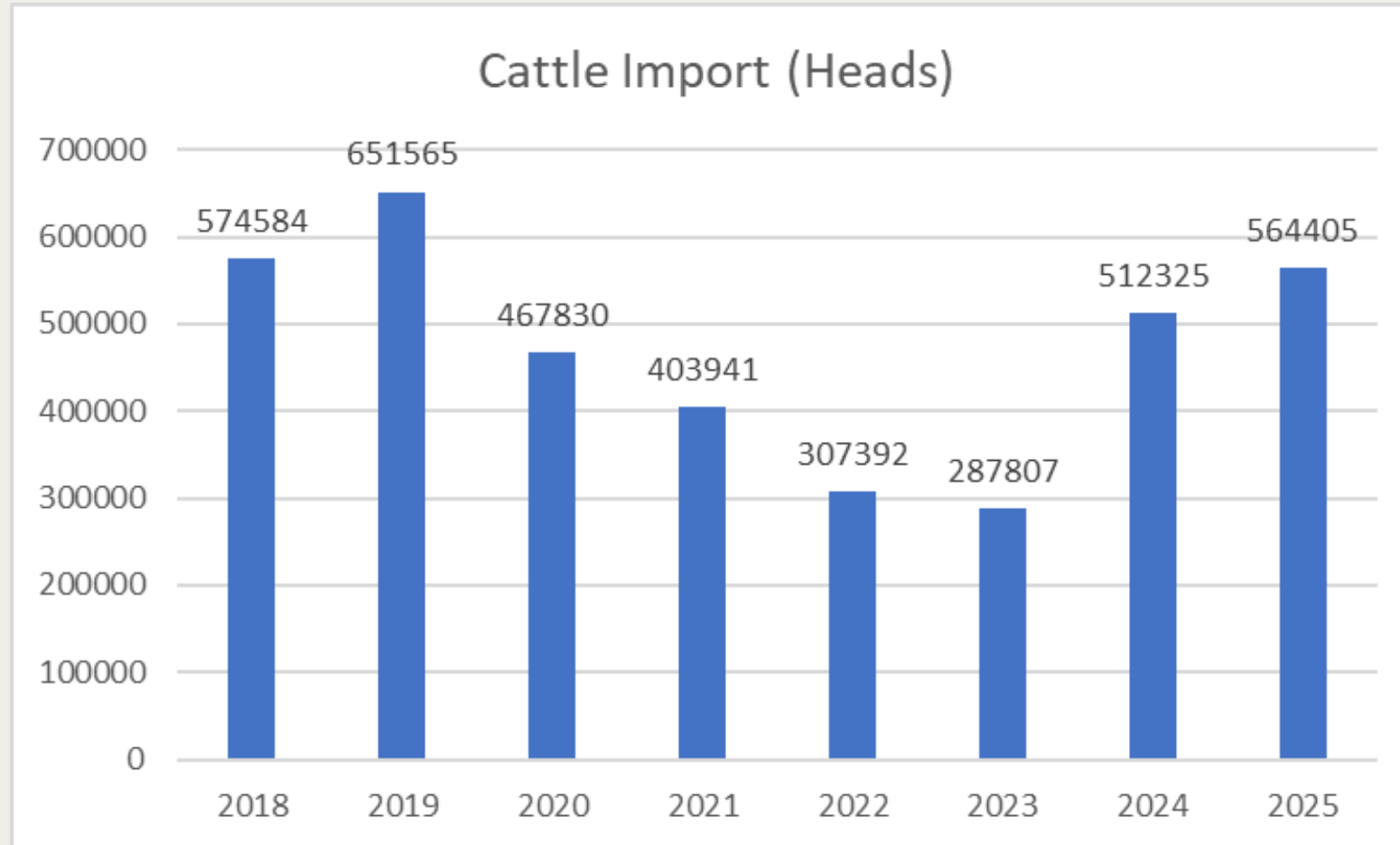

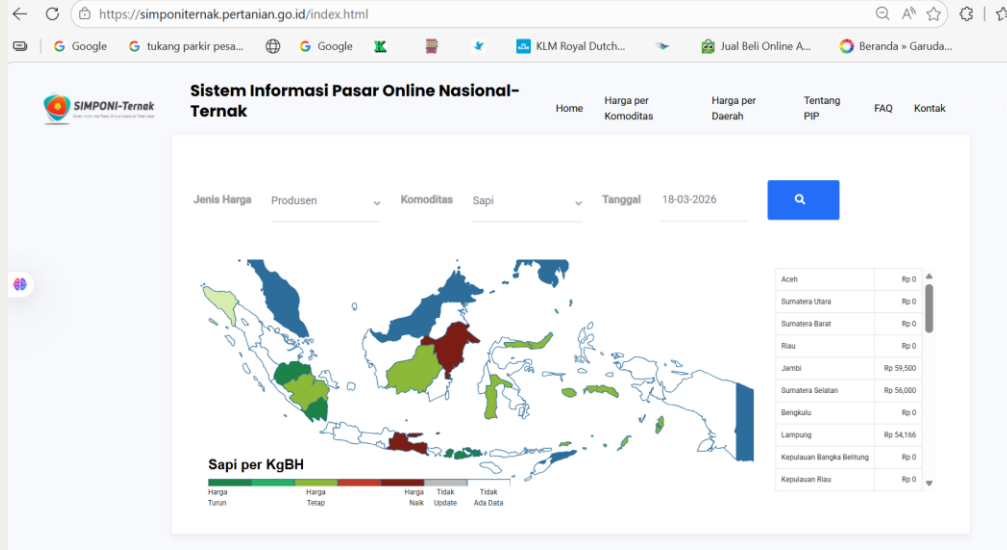

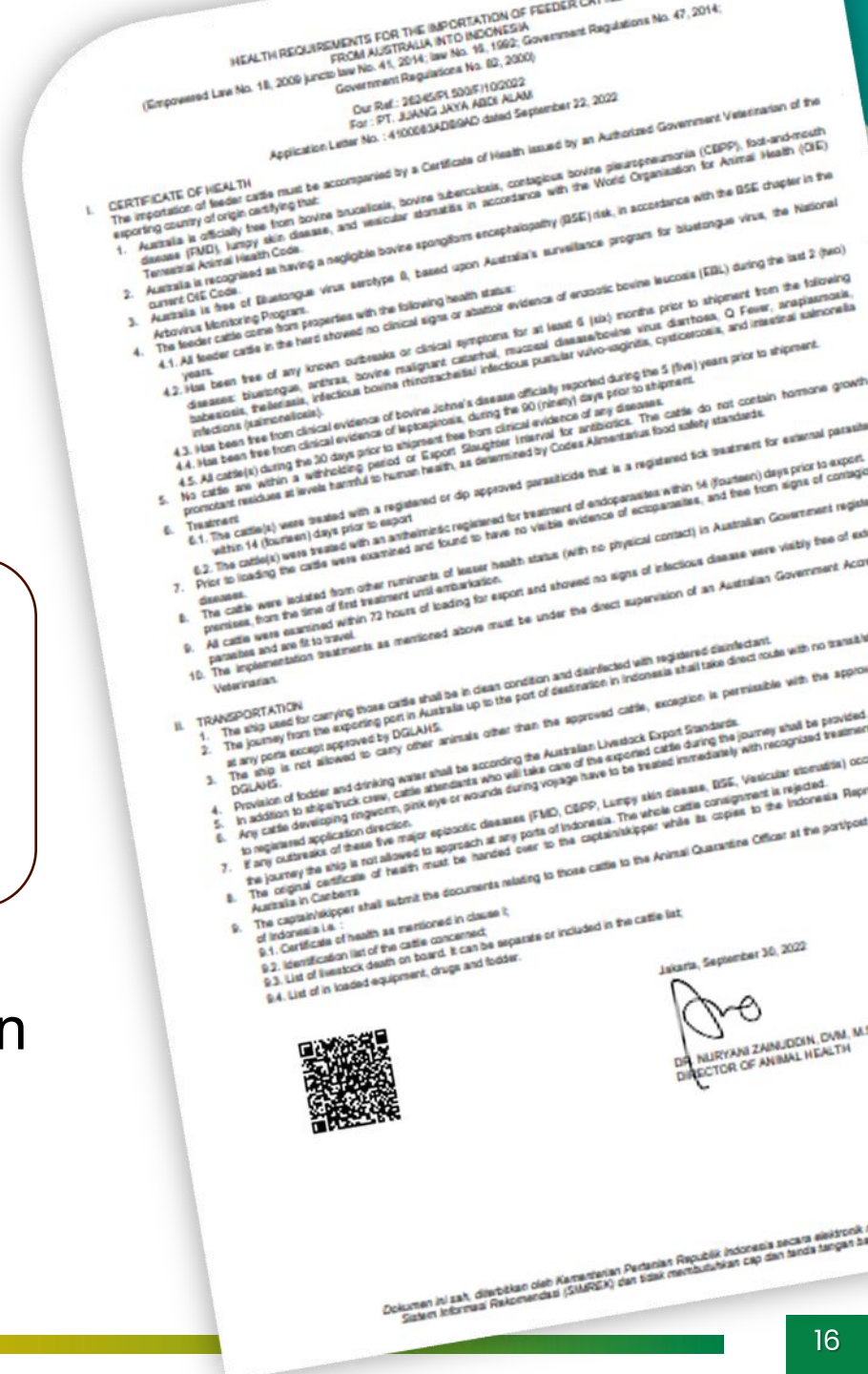


ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION

Animal Health requirements are listed in the **HEALTH REQUIREMENT** documents, contains:

1. Risk identification (hazard)
2. Country requirements, farm, commodity, and quarantine measures based on international standard (WOAH)
3. Technical consideration: Animal Health, Veterinary Public Health, and **Quarantine Expert Commission**.

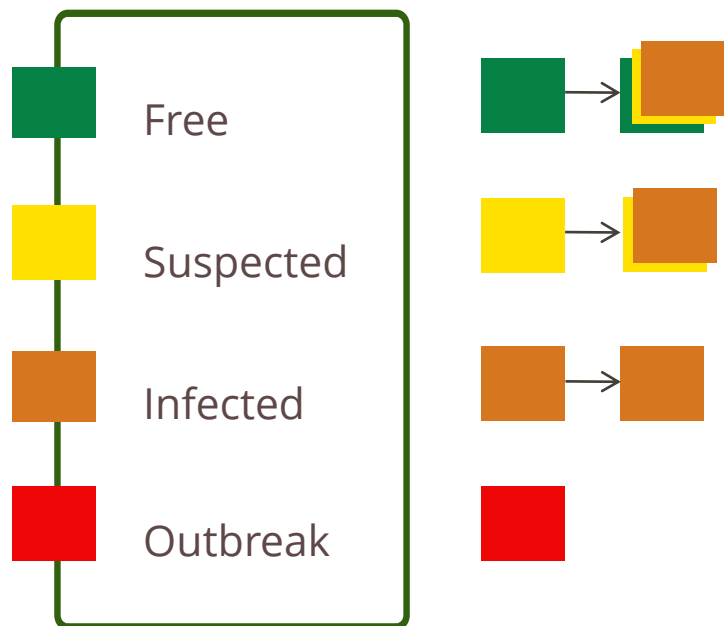


ANIMAL MOVEMENT CONTROL SYSTEM

Procedures for the supervision of animal, animal products, and other carriers of animal disease movement within the territory of the Republic of Indonesia regulated in

MoA Regulation No.17/2023

Animal movement control based on animal disease status in the province and/or district and must meet the animal health requirement for specific animal diseases

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Taking into account:

- Type of commodity (animal, animal product, and/or other carrier)
- Type of animal diseases
- Treatment measures that can **MINIMIZE** or **ELIMINATE THE RISK** of carrying HPM that poses a risk of spreading disease to animals, humans, and the environment.
- Clinical or organoleptic examination of animals
- **ACCREDITED** veterinary laboratory testing or testing designated by the Minister according to the type of animal disease and/or animal product safety

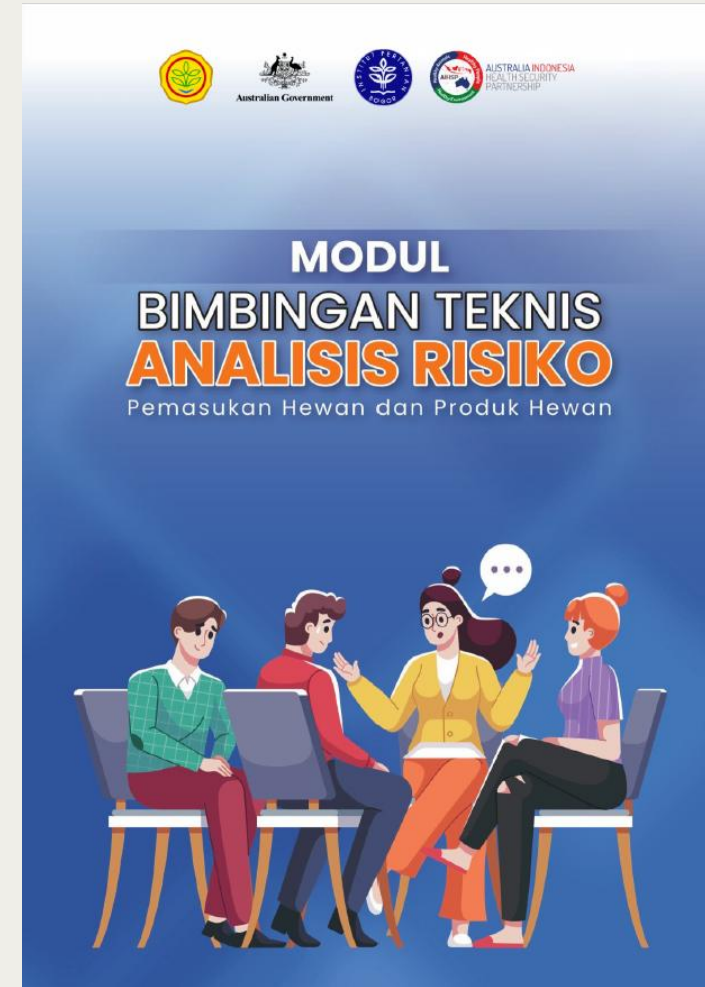
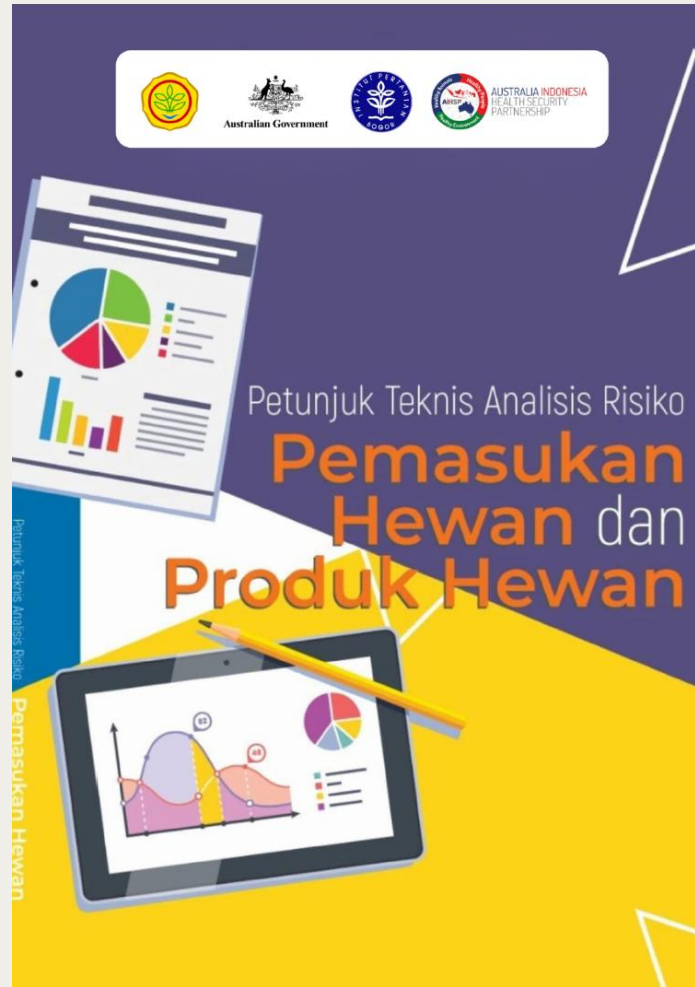

Key messages

1. Indonesia use a zoning approach for the FMD control program and safe trade facilitation
2. Regulations to support the FMD control program and safe trade facilitation were established as a lesson learned from the FMD outbreak
3. There was a change in the movement pattern following the FMD outbreak and the establishment of the regulations
4. Capacity building is essential to support the FMD control program and safe trade facilitation
5. Zoning and compartmentalisation will be an important key to support the FMD control program and safe trade facilitation
6. Private sector and community support is essential for the success of the program
