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Introduction

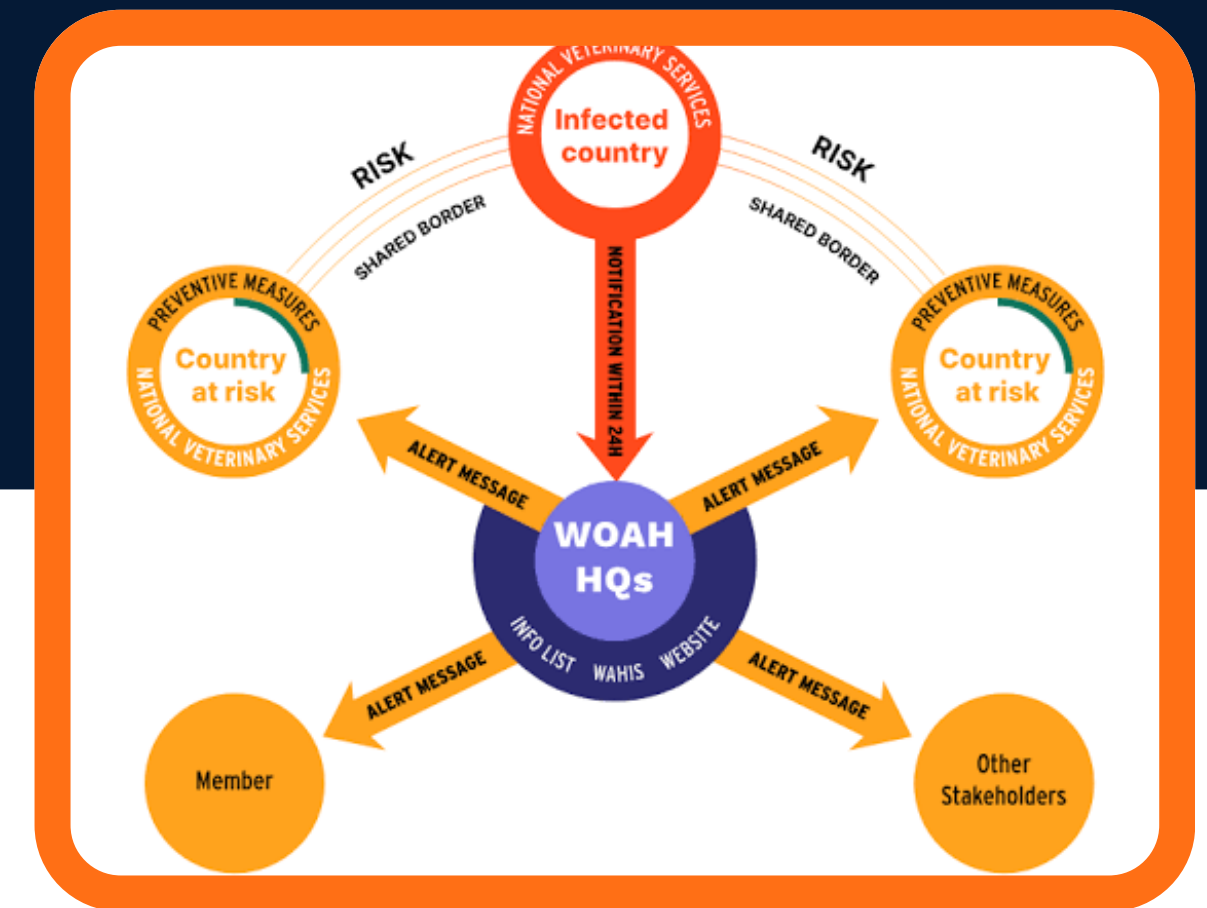
Internship aimed to explore the inner workings of an international organization

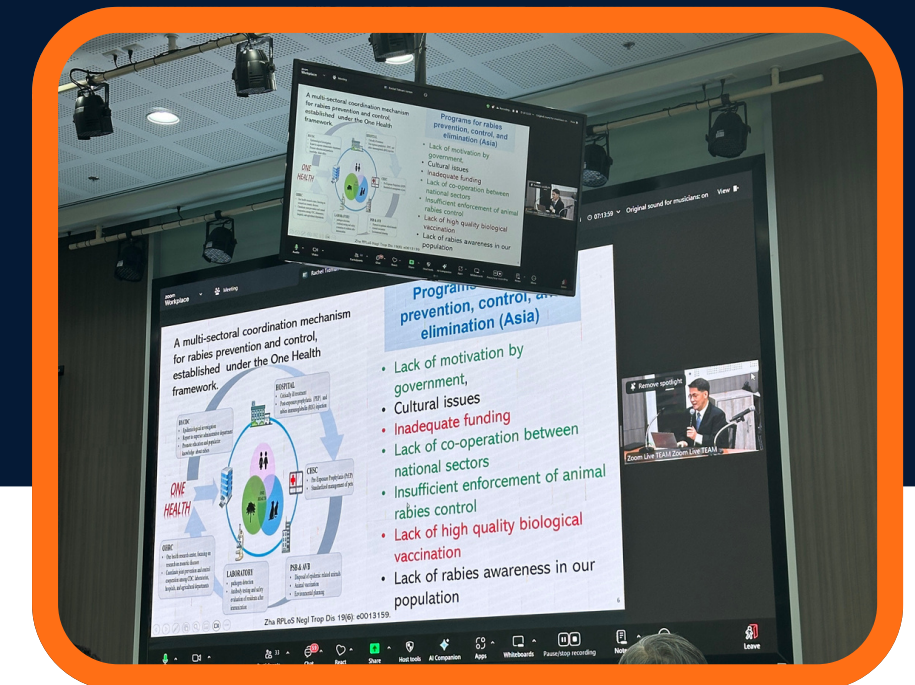

- Understood what career paths align with my interests and strengths

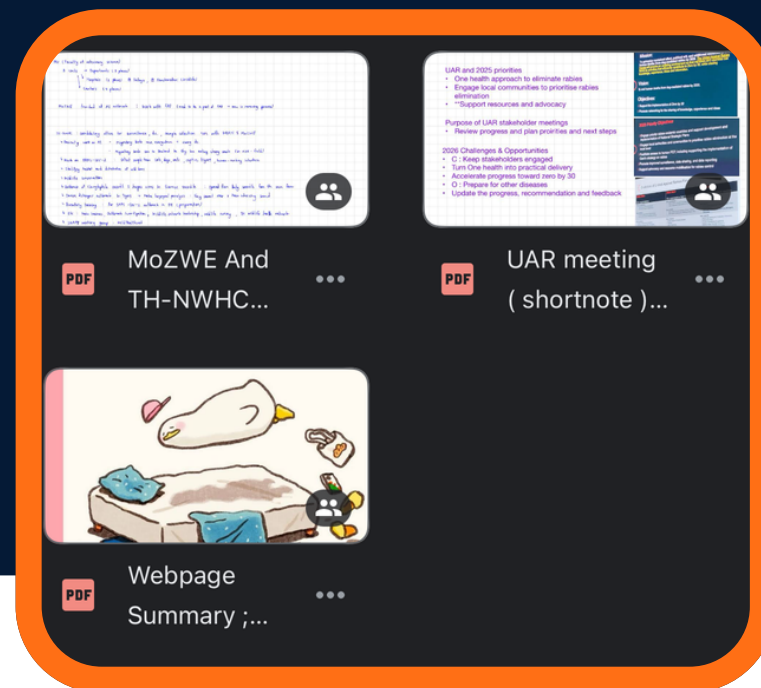
Challenges & Solutions
