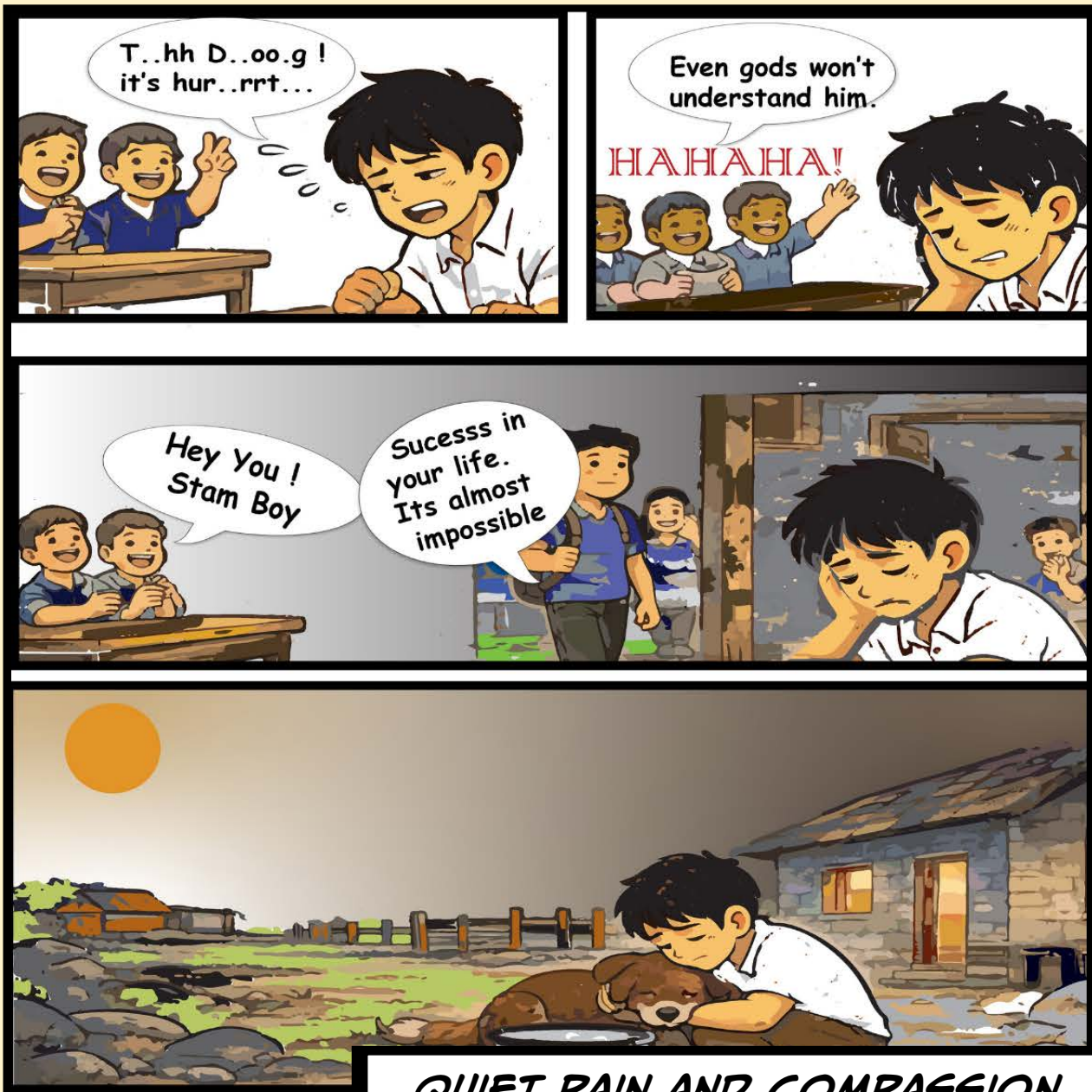

## ABOUT THIS VOLUME

The World Organisation for Animal Health (WOAH) is committed to strengthening gender equality, disability and social inclusion (GEDSI) within the veterinary sector. Our recent work in Asia and the Pacific has shown that, while there is a growing number of qualified women and diverse professionals in the sector, many still face barriers shaped by longstanding norms, insufficient adjustments and unequal opportunities.

As noted in regional studies conducted by WOAH in Asia-Pacific, gender stereotypes influence perceptions within the veterinary sector, and the absence of reasonable accommodations reinforces the exclusion of persons with disabilities. These findings highlight the need for continued awareness and action across institutions, training systems, and professional communities.

To foster this change, WOAH has expanded its GEDSI initiatives, including awareness raising events and partnerships with veterinary associations and networks in Asia and the Pacific region, in particular the Federation of Asian Veterinary Associations (FAVA), the Asian Association of Veterinary Schools (AAVS) and the International Veterinary Students' Association (IVSA). The Comics Competition Promoting GEDSI in the Veterinary Sector, organised between December 2025 and January 2026, invited veterinary students and professionals to reflect creatively on what an inclusive profession looks like.

The competition aimed to celebrate storytelling, artistic talent, veterinary commitment and GEDSI values, and to inspire dialogue through accessible and engaging narratives. Among the winning submissions, the comic presented here captures the imagination, concerns, and aspirations of veterinarians in different parts of the Asia and the Pacific region. The story reminds us that inclusion is not only a policy goal—it is a shared cultural commitment that strengthens the profession and the communities it serves. While we could not award all participants with prizes, we appreciated all entries and will be sharing additional comic stories of note on our website (see QR code on the cover inner page).

We extend our heartfelt congratulations to the winners of this competition, and thank all participants for adding their voices to this important conversation. This comic enriches WOAH's ongoing efforts to promote a veterinary sector where everyone can thrive, advancing our mission to improve animal health and welfare globally and ensure a better future for all.

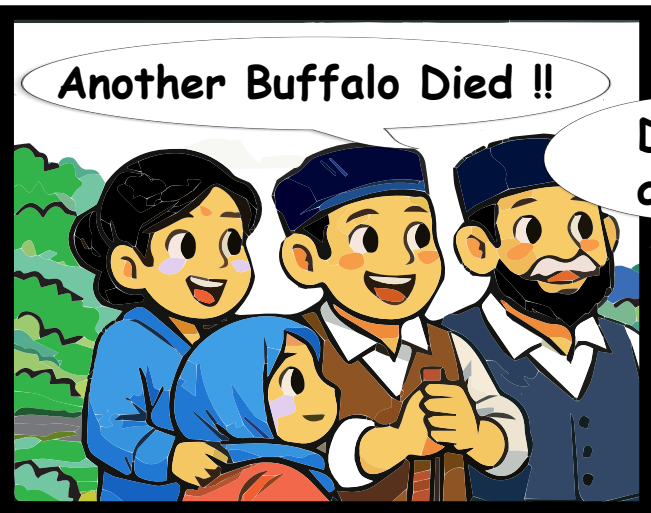
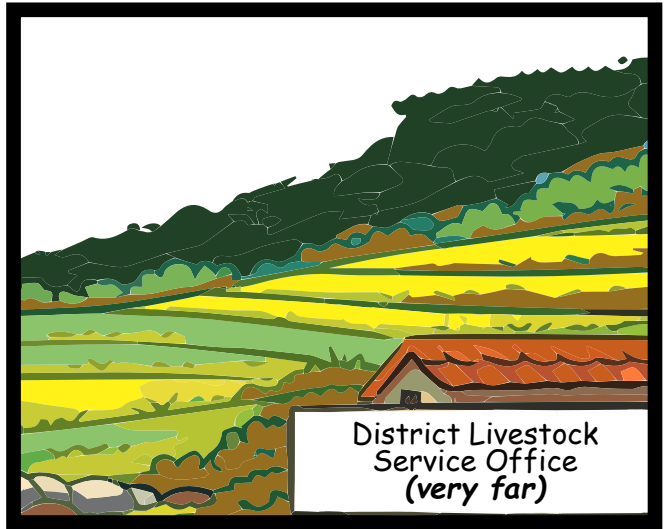
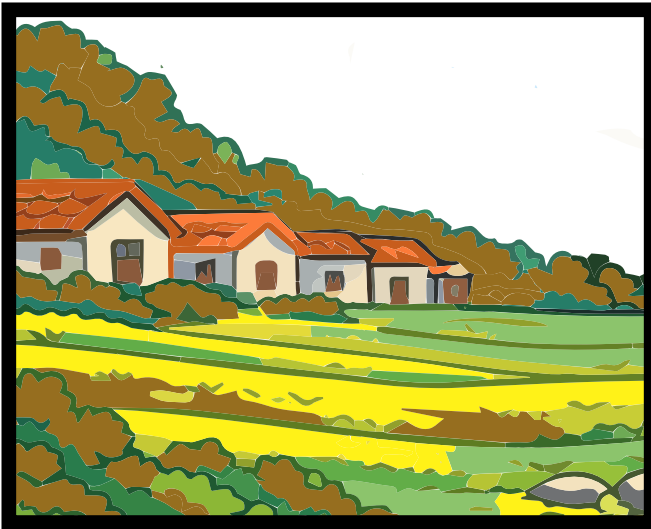

# ABOUT THE AUTHOR

## Sandhya Bhandari

I am Sandhya Bhandari, a veterinary student currently pursuing a Bachelor of Veterinary Science & Animal Health at the Agriculture and Forestry University (AFU), Rampur, Chitwan, Nepal, from Sindhupalchok District, Nepal. I am currently working as an Editor at the International Veterinary Students' Association (IVSA) Rampur and a Research and Data Analyst for the Standing Committee on One Health (Global), with a passion for One Health, addressing zoonotic diseases, and inclusive veterinary practices.

### Comic description

The comic is set in a remote village in the hill of Sindhupalchok district, Nepal, where fear, superstition, and lack of access to veterinary services lead people to abandon livestock and chase dogs, believing diseases are curses rather than preventable conditions.

The story introduces Vidur, a young man with a stammering disability, and Ganga, a determined young woman facing gender bias. Both are underestimated and ignored, yet they choose compassion and science over fear. Through Village Animal Health Worker (VAHW) training, community service, vaccination campaigns, and rabies awareness, they slowly challenge harmful beliefs and promote prevention, reporting, and collective action, later joining Bachelor of Veterinary Science & Animal Health degree programs.




Despite rejection and doubt, their persistence leads to positive change. The villagers begin to understand that zoonotic diseases are preventable, and that knowledge, empathy, and teamwork can save lives. The story highlights gender equality, disability inclusion, and social inclusion (GEDSI) in the veterinary sector.
