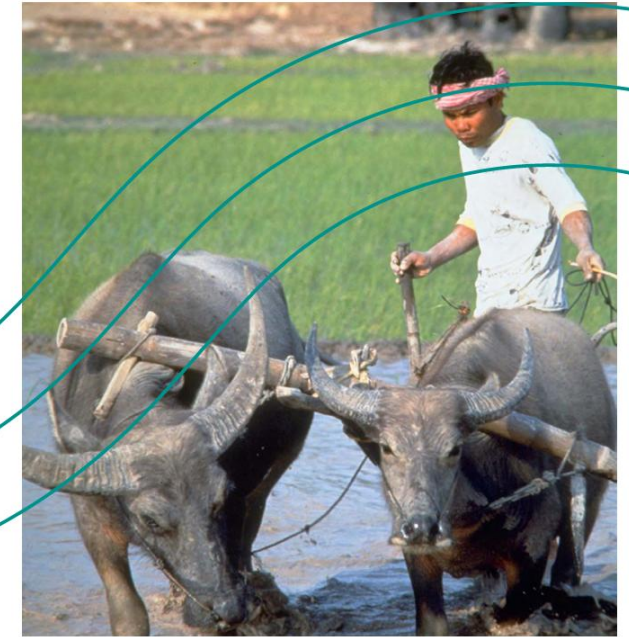
SEACFMD Roadmap 2026 – 2030

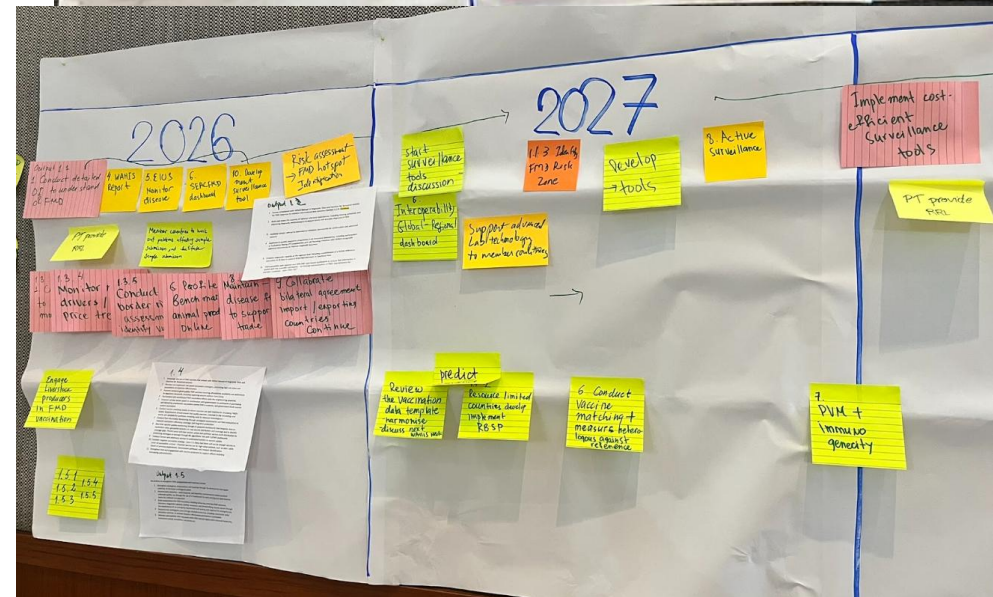

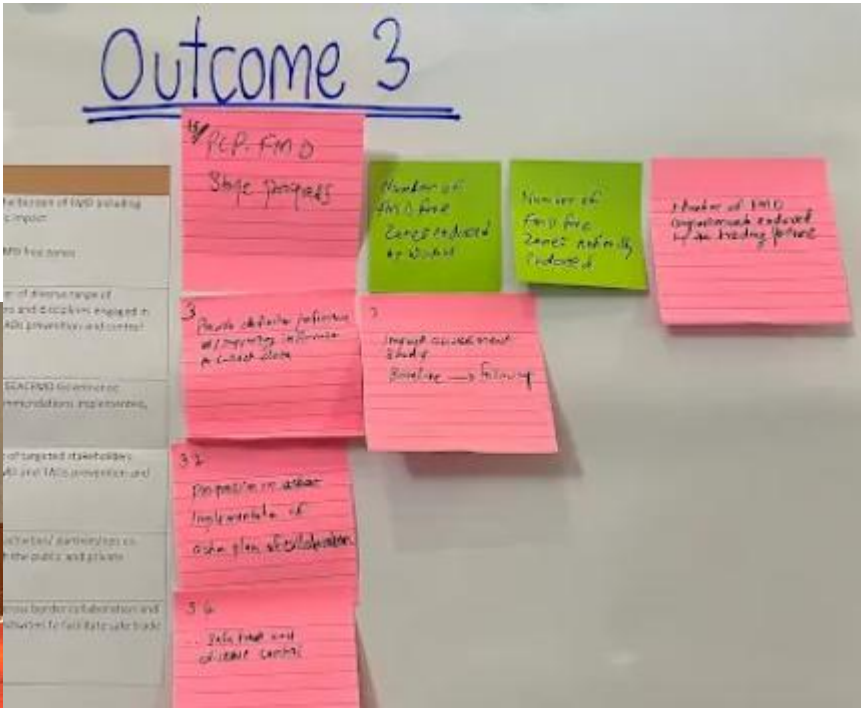
