## Wildlife policy

- Two Key Ministries involved in wildlife policy
  - Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation
    - Animal Health and Livestock Development Law (2020)
    - Veterinary Health Certification
    - Provide vaccination support (Anthrax and FMD vaccine for Elephant)
    - Test for rabies in suspected case in dog
    - Test for African swine fever in wild pig
    - Pathological testing of tiger, elephant
    - Surveillance for emerging viral disease (bat, primate, rodents, bush animals)
  - Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation
    - Protection of Biodiversity and Conservation of Protected Law (2018)
    - CITES permit approval for endangered species transport
    - Collaborate for rabies in suspected dog cases
    - Investigates mass die-offs in wildlife





## Activities relating to wildlife

- Activities performed by Veterinary Services relating to wildlife
  - Clinical care of wildlife
  - Disease surveillance in wildlife
  - Disease prevention (vaccination)
  - Pathological investigation
  - Regular veterinary laboratory service for working elephants










# PREDICT MYANMAR Project

#### **FOCUS**

- Detection and discovery of diseases at the wildlife-human interface
- Four viral families: Paramyxoviridae (Henipavirus of fruit bats), Orthomyxoviridae
   (Influenza viruses), Filoviridae (Ebola, Marburg), Coronaviridae (SARS/ MERS)

  - Reported to OIE WAHIS None


No	Year	Species	No. of Case	No. of Sample

### One Health

- Outline how wildlife are included in One Health activities
  - Veterinarians (LBVD & Timber enterprise) are on a One Health committee, active surveillance of zoonotic diseases in wildlife by Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation
  - Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation works on illegal wildlife trade to reduce risk of emerging infectious diseases
  - Ministry of Health and Sports works also zoonotic
