



- WTO Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Agreement: Details how governments can apply food safety and animal and plant health measures sets when trading products on the world market.
- States the OIE is the reference organisation for animal health measures.




CONTROL OF ANIMAL DISEASES IN THE WORLD





- WOAH international standards serve as a basis for setting national legislation
 - Terrestrial Animal Health Code and Aquatic Animal Health Code
 - Manual of Diagnostic Tests and Vaccines for Terrestrial Animals and the Manual of Diagnostic Tests for Aquatic Animals
- Standards that address foodborne pathogen of animal origin focus on eliminating hazards arising prior to slaughter of animals or primary processing of their products
 - E.g., Prevention, detection and control of *Salmonella* in poultry, bovine production systems, and pig production systems
- Standards also address role of Veterinary Services in food safety systems and links between food production, processing and distribution

 Under the overall control and direction of the Veterinary Authority (the governmental authority)






Early detection of diseases and infections at their animal source can prevent transmission to humans or introduction of pathogens into the food chain



The Role of Veterinary Authority in Food Safety

- Responsibilities depend on the national structure of food safety systems
- Responsible for developing policies, legislation and regulations relevant to food safety thereby contributing to ensuring the safety of food of animal origin
